A. Walton and P. K. Van Doorn on October 7 through October 14, 1994. The inspection included a review of activities authorized for your Watts Bar facility. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with those members of your staff identified in the enclosed report. This special NRC inspection involved review of corrective actions to previously identified inspection findings. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures, condition adverse to quality reports, work implementing documents, and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observation of activities in progress. Based on the results of this inspection, certain of your activities appeared to be in violation of NRC requirements, as specified in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice). The deficiencies discussed within the enclosed inspection report were the subject of an NRC and TVA management meeting held at the NRC Rockville offices on October 19, 1994. As discussed during the meeting, the NRC continues to identify significant problems with the implementation of corrective actions. One of the identified violation examples deals with the use of 600 V rated splice connectors in safety-related 6900 V applications. This same technical concern was first identified in 1986 and remains unresolved. The overall common element to the identified deficiencies indicates a lack of management involvement in assuring minimum quality standards are achieved. Some of the examples of the violations contained herein are considered repetitive in that they are similar to previous violations cited. Even though they have been categorized at Severity Level IV in this report, we consider the lack of effective corrective action to preclude recurrence to be a serious matter. Accordingly, you are advised that if further violations occur because your corrective action was ineffective, more significant enforcement action will be taken. 280011 9411290081 941110 ADDCK 05000390

In your response, you should document the specific actions taken and any additional actions you plan to prevent recurrence. After reviewing your response to this Notice, including your proposed corrective actions and the results of future inspections, the NRC will determine whether further NRC enforcement action is necessary to ensure compliance with NRC regulatory requirements. In accordance with 10 CFR 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter, its enclosures, and any reply will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room.

The responses directed by this letter and the enclosed Notice are not subject to the clearance procedures of the Office of Management and Budget as required by the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980, Pub. L. 96-511.
