WATTS BAR NUCLEAR PLANT (WBN) - UNIT 1 AND UNIT 2 - NRC INSPECTION REPORT NO. 50-390, 391/94-58 - CHANGE IN COMMITMENT METHODOLOGY FOR NOTICE OF VIOLATION

TVA's letter of November 9, 1994, provided a response to Violation 390/94-58-03 cited in the subject Inspection Report, dated October 6, 1994. The violation concerned a failure to comply with administrative requirements for the use of Operations Night Orders. The purpose of this letter is to notify the staff of a change in methodology for implementing recurrence control action No. 1 stated in our November response. action No. 1, TVA committed to use the P/2 Scheduling System to track and schedule the performance of periodic actions contained in Operations' administrative procedures. TVA has now determined that until performance improves, effective management of these periodic actions will be accomplished using appropriate management controls such as the Surveillance Program Matrix (same system utilized for WBN surveillance instructions) or other alternatives. Due to the time required to complete development and approval of the interface procedures for this process, TVA now expects the tracking system to be in effect by March 14, 1995. In the interim, the Operations' internal tracking system will remain in effect.

The enclosure summarizes the commitment made in this submittal.
