
Dear Nuclear Regulatory Commission Chief:

I am writing to urge you to support the Early Site permit submitted for additional nuclear units at Plant Vogtle in Burke County, Georgia. By 2030, the population of the state of Georgia is expected to increase by 4 million residents, and our state will need the additional base load generating capacity offered by the expansion of Plant Vogtle.


Nuclear power is a safe, reliable, cost-effective source of electricity. Its low production costs are matched only by its price stability, a marked contrast from the volatility of the price of natural gas. In addition, supporting nuclear energy encourages fuel diversity and energy independence. Adding additional nuclear units to plants such as Vogtle is one way we can decrease our dependence on foreign oil.

The scientific data and the public support clearly designate nuclear power as the safe, cost effective and environmentally friendly energy of the future. For these reasons, I strongly support these additional nuclear units at Vogtle, as well as the expansion of nuclear power throughout the United States.
