Expedite\_UrgencyToInformText: This request is being made to report timely information regarding an investigation at a nuclear power plant in the newspaper's circulation area.

Waiver\_Purpose: This information is sought to further report on and clarify the results of an investigation at Millstone Power Station in Waterford CT which impinges on the safety-conscious work environment there and potential whistleblower activity.

Waiver\_ExtentToExtractAnalyze: The Day will report on the substantive content of the records, even if redacted, as long as it further informs the public.

Waiver\_SpecificActivityQuals: I am a veteran news reporter who regularly covers Millstone Power Station. The records will be used to add to my and my editors' understanding of this issue, which we have already partially reported, and if possible given redaction, be used to inform the public more fully of the nature of the case.

Waiver\_ImpactPublicUnderstanding: The public's right to know and be informed about the power plant owner Dominion's maintenance of a safety-conscious work environment is likely to lead to better interaction with all parties, including public oversight committees like the Nuclear Energy Advisory Council.

Waiver\_NatureOfPublic: Our readership, about 40,000 Sunday papers, the circulation area, and through the web the public at large interested in this topic.

Waiver\_MeansOfDissemination: print newspaper and Internet
