This is submitted as a final response to Directorate of Regulatory Operations Bulletin No. 74-6 transmitted by your May 30, 1974, letter RO:II:NCM 50-327, -328, -390, -391.

Arrangements have been made with the Westinghouse Electric Corporation, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, to have their site personnel at Sequoyah Nuclear Plant work with TVA site personnel to inspect the W-2 switches and correct any problems. Repair parts will also be inspected to assure that no defective parts are used. The Sequoyah Nuclear Plant inspection program is scheduled to be completed by May 1, 1975, for units 1 and 2.

As previously stated in our interim report, dated July 3, 1974, no W-2 switches have been shipped from Westinghouse for the Watts Bar Nuclear Plant; therefore, we do not feel it is necessary to extend this inspection program to the Watts Bar Nuclear Plant.
