Thank you for taking time with me on the phone this AM.

I spoke of a website that had info on the NOI to prepare GEIS for uranium. Below is the link that tells of the extended comment period. Does the official comment period end on 10/14?

The NOI is at this site as well. In the summary, It states the GIS will assess effects of the ISL process and "may" assess alternative methods. Is that true?

Listed are 2 meetings w/ press and public for informal discussion. They were held in WY. and NM where, as I understand it, uranium mining and processing now occur. I request that a public meeting be held on the east coast, specifically Danville Virginia, for the purpose of education to the public on mining, processing, transporting and disposal techniques concerning uranium and radioactive wastes from processing. Of particular interest would be how east coast protocol may differ from those employed in the areas that are currently being mined. I request the meeting be held in Danville, not Richmond, Roanoke or Charlottesville, due to the fact that there exists a company, which desires to mine at Coles Hill." That being said, I further request that Mr. William Von Till

attend to impart general or technical information associated with safety and licensing of uranium milling facilities.

The NOI states it is expecting numerous license applications for in-situ leach. Has there been any application rendered or activity in your agency regarding Virginia Uranium, Inc?

The NOI states "this GEIS is intended to address the common issues associated with the environmental reviews of such milling facilities located in the western United States." Chatham, Virginia is definitely NOT in the western United States. If you are to consider Environmental impact Areas to be Analyzed, I believe inclusion Chatham/Danville area will help to offer a more comprehensive analysis.

The NOI states it exists to "encourage public involvement in the GEIS process and to solicit public comments on the proposed scope and content of the GEIS." I feel that the citizens, community leaders, and elected officials need some background and insight regarding the uranium industry and licensing and permitting process. Better now, than later.

The NRC cannot comment on your first question, which refers to DOE and DOI. We have received no indication from industry of an interest to recover uranium in Virginia, either through conventional mining (which NRC does not regulate, only the milling) or through in-situ leach recovery (which NRC does regulate).

If NRC receives an application for uranium milling or ISL recovery, we would issue a public notice and an opportunity to request a hearing. Anyone who can demonstrate standing and raise a contention against the proposed license may file to become an "intervenor."

* Virginia has had a moratorium on the mining of uranium since the early 1980s. Can DOE, DOI or both render the moratorium as null and void? Under what circumstances might that occur?

* Is there discussion at present at DOE, DOI or NRC to mine or process uranium in Virginia?

* If it was decided to mine or process uranium in Virginia would public hearings be held?

I am hopeful that you will answer questions as well as cite specific code references.
