SUBJECT: COMPLETION OF EVALUATION OF THE FIRST 10-YEAR INTERVAL

INSPECTION PROGRAM PLAN AND REQUESTS FOR RELIEF FOR THE WATTS

BAR NUCLEAR PLANT (TAC NO. M95440)

Dear Mr. Scalice:

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory (NRC) staff, with technical assistance from its contractor, the Idaho National Engineering and Environmental Laboratory (INEEL), has reviewed and evaluated the information provided by the Tennessee Valley Authority, in its letters dated May 9, and November 25, 1996, March 24, and August 8, 1997, regarding its first 10-year interval Inservice Inspection (ISI) program plan and associated requests for relief for the Watts Bar Nuclear Plant, Unit 1.

The staff has found that there are no deviations from regulatory requirements or commitments that were identified except those noted in the attached evaluation of Request for Relief 1-ISI-1. Of the total of ten requests for relief submitted, five are authorized and one is denied as stated in the enclosure, three were authorized by the staff's letter of September 23, 1997 and one was authorized by the staff's letter of August 11, 1997.

The NRC staff's safety evaluation and conclusions are contained in the Enclosure. Attached to the Enclosure is the INEEL Technical Letter Report. The staff concludes that for Relief Requests ISPT-01, and ISPT-05, the licensee has demonstrated that specific Code requirements would result in hardship or unusual difficulty without a compensating increase in the level of quality and safety. Therefore, pursuant to 10 CFR 50.55a(a)(3)(ii), the licensee's proposed alternatives are authorized. The staff concludes that for Relief Requests 1-ISI-2, 1-ISI-3 and ISPT-04, the licensee has demonstrated that the proposed alternatives provide an acceptable level of quality and safety. Accordingly, the staff authorizes the use of such alternatives pursuant to 10 CFR 50.55a(a)(3)(i). The staff concludes for Request for Relief No. 1-ISI-1, that based on the licensee's use of Code Case N-509, "Alternative Rules for the Selection and Examination of Class 1, 2, and 3, Integral Welded Attachments, Section XI, Division 1" contained in Request for Relief No. 1-ISI-2 as approved above, no significant burden exists. Accordingly, Request for Relief No. 1-ISI-1 is denied.

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The licensee's proposed alternatives to use Code Cases N-509, N-524 and N-522 contained in Requests for Relief Nos. 1-ISI-2, 1-ISI-3 and ISPT-04 and the use of Code Case N-498-1 in Request for Relief ISPT-01, respectively, are authorized for the current interval or until such time as the Code Cases are published in Regulatory Guide (RG) 1.147. At that time, if the licensee intends to continue to implement these Code Cases, the licensee should follow all provisions in Code Cases N-509, N-524, N-522 and N-498-1, with limitations issued in RG 1.147, if any.
