SUBJECT: SHEARON HARRIS NUCLEAR POWER PLANT UNIT 1, LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION REVIEW

Dear Dr. Crow:

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff is reviewing an application to renew the operating license for the Shearon Harris Nuclear Power Plant, Unit 1 (HNP), which is located in Wake County, North Carolina. HNP is operated by Carolina Power and Light Company, doing business as Progress Energy Carolinas, Inc. (CP&L). As part of its review of the proposed action, the NRC staff has prepared a draft site-specific Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) to its "Generic Environmental Impact Statement for License Renewal of Nuclear Plants" (GEIS), NUREG-1437. The draft SEIS includes analyses of relevant environmental issues, including potential impacts to historic, archeological and cultural properties from extended operation and refurbishment activities associated with license renewal. In accordance with our letter to you dated March 20, 2007, a copy of the draft supplement is enclosed. Pursuant to 36 CFR 800.8(c), we are requesting your comments on our preliminary conclusions regarding historic properties.

As stated in our March 20, 2007 letter, the NRC staff has determined that the area of potential effect (APE) for a license renewal action is the area at the power plant site and its immediate environs that may be impacted by post-license renewal land disturbing operation or projected refurbishment activities associated with the proposed action. The staff views the APE for the HNP license renewal as including the HNP site, its immediate environs and the associated transmission lines.

The NRC staff has conducted an environmental audit at the site and has reviewed historic and archaeological records. The NRC staff also contacted five Native American Tribes identified as having potential interest in the proposed undertaking. To date, no comments have been received.

In the context of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, under which the draft environmental impact statement was prepared, the NRC staff's preliminary determination is that the impact of license renewal on historical and archaeological resources is small, and current measures to mitigate potential impacts are adequate. Under the provisions of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, the NRC staff's preliminary determination is that no historic properties will be affected by the proposed action.
