Dear Mr. Colvin:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 26 to your NRC Material License No. 12-10243-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold font**.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

You will note that this license has been renewed for a term of two years. This is because it is our understanding that you are in the process of preparing to terminate this license. In addition, your renewal application dated May 2, 2007, did not address any elements of your licensed program.

Therefore, we temporarily continued your license under the previously approved documents incorporated into your license in Condition No. 18 and we limited your authorization for materials in Subitem Nos. 6.A. and 6.B. to "storage and possession only, pending disposal." It is unclear to me at this time whether your sealed sources in Subitem Nos. 6.C. through 6.F. are under general or specific licensure, based upon my review of your letter dated November 7, 2007. So I continued to authorize their use under the terms of this license for the time being.

You will need to take prompt and definitive action regarding this license to request termination of the license. My review of your letter dated November 7, 2007, is complete and I will be contacting you in the next 10 days to transmit, discuss and resolve the remaining additional information needed to continue the termination process of this license.

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. Pursuant to NRC's RIS 2005-31 and in accordance with 10 CFR 2.390, the enclosed license document is exempt from public disclosure because its disclosure to unauthorized individuals could present a security vulnerability.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
