### 6.9KV CIRCUIT BREAKERS

Protective devices are tested periodically by performance of a preventive maintenance instruction

Relay Calibration

36/48 month

**Functional Test** 

18 month

performed by manually actuating the protective device and verifying the associated breaker or lockout device is tripped.

### 480V SWITCHGEAR BREAKERS

Test is performed every two years or at the trip count interval for that type breaker.

Amptector Trip Unit Test

Test of Instantaneous, Short Time, and long Time Delay of the

amptector unit.

**Functional Test** 

Performs a functional test of the breaker by primary current

injection at the long time setting only.

#### 480V MCC BREAKERS

## NO CURRENT PERIODICALLY SCHEDULED TESTING

An existing Maintenance Instruction is available which performs circuit breaker inspections and tests.

This instruction could be used with modifications or a new instruction would be required to be written.

Current plan would be to test the individual trip elements for the additional breakers.
