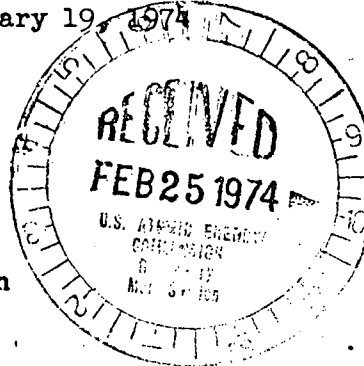

By letters dated January 22, 1974, the Regulatory Staff requested information to aid in determining, for facilities under construction, if quality assurance personnel have sufficient authority and organizational freedom to perform their critical function effectively and without reservations.

Information substantiating that all quality assurance personnel, within the TVA Office of Engineering Design and Construction, have this independence is contained in portions of Amendment 9 to the Bellefonte Nuclear Plant application (Docket Nos. 50-438 and 50-439), submitted on February 6, 1974. We hereby incorporate by reference into the Sequoyah and Watts Bar applications the following portions of the Bellefonte PSAR:

Figures 17.1A-1 through 17.1A-11

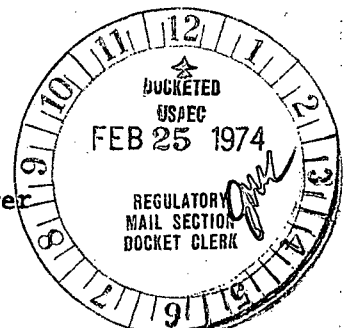
A copy of the above reference material is enclosed for your convenience. The Westinghouse response is given in Enclosure 3.
