Enclosed copy of TVA denial of my nuclear plant access plant security clearance dated June 21, 1994; a copy of the appeal dated June 27, 1994; TVA intent of termination dated June 28, 1994.

Please add this documentation to my petition filed Feb 25, 1994; Docket Nos 50-390, 50-391, (10 CFR 2.206)

TVA is using my guilty plea with was amisdemeanor in the state of Maryland for a reason for denying my security clearance.

Please realize that I have been under severe mental and physical stress for the past seven and a half years, due to continuous intimidation, harrassment, reprisal and discrimination actions taken agaist me by TVA.

At the time on March 24, 1994 when arrested at Nuclear Regulatory Commission Office at Bethesda, Maryland, I had been under continous psychiatric treatment for work related stress and depression since June of 1993. My psychiatrist Daniel Brumback died Jan 24, 1994; this added to my stressful situation. I had attempted to get additional psychiatric treatment, I had met with psychiatrist Sarath Gangavarapu on March 23, 1994; after interview he refused to accept me as a patient; this added to my stress and is when I made the decission to drive to Washington, D.C. to talk with NRC and request additional assistance and report additional safety concerns relating to my personal safety and continous discrimination and attempts to discredit me as a whis-el blower.

In May of 1993 I requested NRC Inspector Glen Walton to attend a meeting as a witness and to prevent additional reprisal and discrimination actions being taken agaist me, Mr Walton informed me that his direct supervisor advised him not to attend.

On July 8, 1993 I was harrassed in a meeting with maint manager C. D. Nelson to the point that I had a heart-a-tact. Please note in my previous response the Dept of Labor ruling that TVA was to pay all medical and psychiatric difference that my medical insurance does not cover.

At the time I entered the NRC Office on March 24, 1994; I had not had any sleep in approximately 29 hours, for I had driven all night from my resident in Tennessee to the NRC Office in Maryland. I had diffuctly in finding parking and was just in a hurry

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to meet with NRC Representivies and get back to Tennessee. Had I been thinking more clearly I would have never entered a govemnt building with a weapon. I had no criminal intent in carring the hand gun. I am only concerned with my personal safety.

On June 21, 1994, my truck was trampted with; my dogs wroke me just before daylight, and when I got up to investigate; I heard a vehicle leave at a high rate of speed; later that day, I started to drive into Decatur for some caulking to repair a water leak in my air condition. I felt my left front tire bumping quite badly, I drove on into town very slowly, got my caulking, and returned home. Upon checking the left front tire; I found that someone had added air pressure to a 110 pounds. With intent of causing the tire to blow out, resulting in an accident. The highway in both directions from my home has many sharp cruves and had the tire blown out, at a modulate speed; it would have probably caused a severe accident.

TVA at Watts Bar Nuclear Plant has already intimateded personnel to the point that no one will take the chance on reporting nuclear safety concerns, or even admit that they are aware of safety concerns, or will admit to being intimateded or afraid to report safety concerns. I can point out over a hundrend safety concerns in safety related equipment that TVA is aware of, but making no attempt to correct and are hoping that they will go un-noticed.

If TVA is permitted to perceive with my termination, the NRC will be responsible for permitting TVA to take any type of discrimination actions, it desires agaist its employees.

Their action is also an attempt to avoid libability for my mental and physcial disabilities. If they suceed, I will not only loose my job, I will also loose my medical insurance coverage and greatly reduce my retirement benefits. All for doing what I believe to be the right thing as required by federal law in reporting nuclear safety concerns.

TVA is aware that I have spent many throusands of dollars on attonery fees and can no longer aford an attorney to represent me in a Dept of Labor hearing, therefore leaving my only help in the hands of NRC and appeals to united states congressman.

Your help will be greatly appreciated.



Dear Mr. Gillilan:

On March 25, 1994, Personnel Screening & Badging (PS&B) suspended your Nuclear Plant Access security clearance following your arrest at the headquarters of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) in Bethesda, Maryland. The NRC is the Federal agency charged with responsibility to regulate the nation's nuclear power plants, and its offices are clearly marked with signs prohibiting weapons or firearms in the building. You were charged with two counts of carrying a concealed weapon.

PS&B investigated this event for two months and has determined that your security clearance should be revoked effective June 21, 1994. This determination has been made following my lengthy interviews with you and my review of the pertinent facts of this case. I have based my decision on your criminal conduct at the NRC headquarters, your continuing disregard for the law in the area of deadly weapons, and your failure to appreciate the severity and consequences of your actions.

Specifically, in our interviews, you admitted that you carried two concealed weapons into the NRC headquarters and that you pled guilty to one count of carrying a concealed weapon--a loaded pistol. Your explanation to me, that you carry a weapon to defend yourself from your enemies, was not reasonable in light of your admission that you had no known enemies at the NRC. Further, in our interviews, you acknowledged that you carry a loaded, concealed weapon (pistol) most of the time, and have done so for a lengthy period of time even though you know that doing so is a violation of state laws. Finally, you have not accepted full responsibility for the consequences of your actions and did not provide me with any assurance that this type of incident will not reoccur.

These matters raise serious questions about your judgment and reflect adversely on your trustworthiness and dependability in working at a nuclear plant. TVA has a responsibility to its employees and the public to maintain a safe working environment and to assure that its nuclear plant workers meet high standards in these areas. Because you fail to meet these standards, I have decided that your security clearance should be revoked.

You may request a review of this decision to the Screening Review Board (SRB) and appear before the SRB at the next scheduled meeting. This will give you an opportunity to present any additional information that you desire to present. You have the right to have representation of your choice present with you at the meeting. The request for review must be filed within seven days of receiving this notification. The request for review should be directed in writing to C. L. Kelley, Chairman, SRB, Tennessee Valley Authority, Warehouse Row 5G, Chattanooga, Tennessee 37402-2801.





Dear Mr. Gillilan:

This is to notify you that you are remaining in non-work pay status as a result of your nuclear plant unescorted access clearance being denied.

As you know, all Watts Bar Nuclear Plant employees must maintain a security clearance. As a result of the denial of this clearance to you, a proposal to terminate your employment is currently under review.

As you have been advised by letter, you have a right to appeal the denial of your clearance. The decision to propose your termination will be made after any appeal has been decided.

Until otherwise notified by myself, you will remain in non-work pay status and not permitted to report to Watts Bar unless coordinated with me personally. Your pay status is contingent upon you remaining in the area and being available to me.
