By Reference 1, TVA provided a revised issue of the Seismic Analysis CAP for Watts Bar Unit 1 to NRC for review and concurrence. Enclosure 3 of Reference 1 provided TVA's response to the 9 comments/action items related to the seismic CAP, as documented in Reference 2. Item No. 7 of the 9 comments was a request that TVA provide a copy of the references justifying the use of damping values for conduit, cable tray, and heating, ventilating, and air conditioning (i.e., ANCO testing). In our response to the request, TVA stated that the information would be submitted on or about July 31, 1989. Due to unanticipated delays, this information will now be submitted on or about November 1, 1989.
