Gentlemen:

Reference is made to Source Material Licenses No. C-3508, Amendment No. 4 dated May 9, 1957 and C-3572, Amendment No. 2 dated May 7, 1957.

Request is hereby made for the consolidation of these two licenses into a single one under which The Martin Company will be authorized to receive possession of and title to 10,000 pounds of magnesium-thorium alloys for developmental and production purposes at its Middle River, Maryland facilities.


In addition to projects of the Martin Baltimore Division, it is contemplated that some fabrication work will be performed for the Denver Division of the Martin Company under transfers from Denver's Source Material License No. C-3670, Revision 3 dated February 19, 1957. Later similar services may be done for Martin Orlando Division if that unit obtains thorium alloys under AEC license.

The Martin Company has now centralized control of thorium-magnesium materials used at its Middle River facilities. These materials are now retained in inventory in a special enclosed area and are distributed under strict accountability procedures to various operating projects. Monitoring of activities under direction of the Martin Health Physics Supervisor, Mr. Paul Guinn, is performed to ensure that requirements of Part 20 CFR 10 are followed.
