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OVERVIEW

This publication provides a compilation of statistical information covering enrollments in Pennsylvania public, private and nonpublic schools. Public schools totaled 3,248 which included: 19 comprehensive area vocational-technical schools (AVTSs), 66 occupational AVTSs, 116 charter schools, two consortium-operated alternative high schools, 9 juvenile correctional institutions, two state-owned schools and 3,034 schools in school districts. There were 2,404 private and nonpublic schools. This publication contains a variety of information including total enrollments by grade and county, the religious affiliation of private and nonpublic schools and the number of elementary and secondary schools.

In 2005-06, pre-Kindergarten (PreK) enrollments for the public schools were collected for the second time. A total of 8,790 PreK students were reported.

The source of this data is an annual survey of all Pennsylvania public, private and nonpublic schools. National data was drawn from the results of surveys conducted by the U.S. Department of Education, National Center for Education Statistics (NCES).

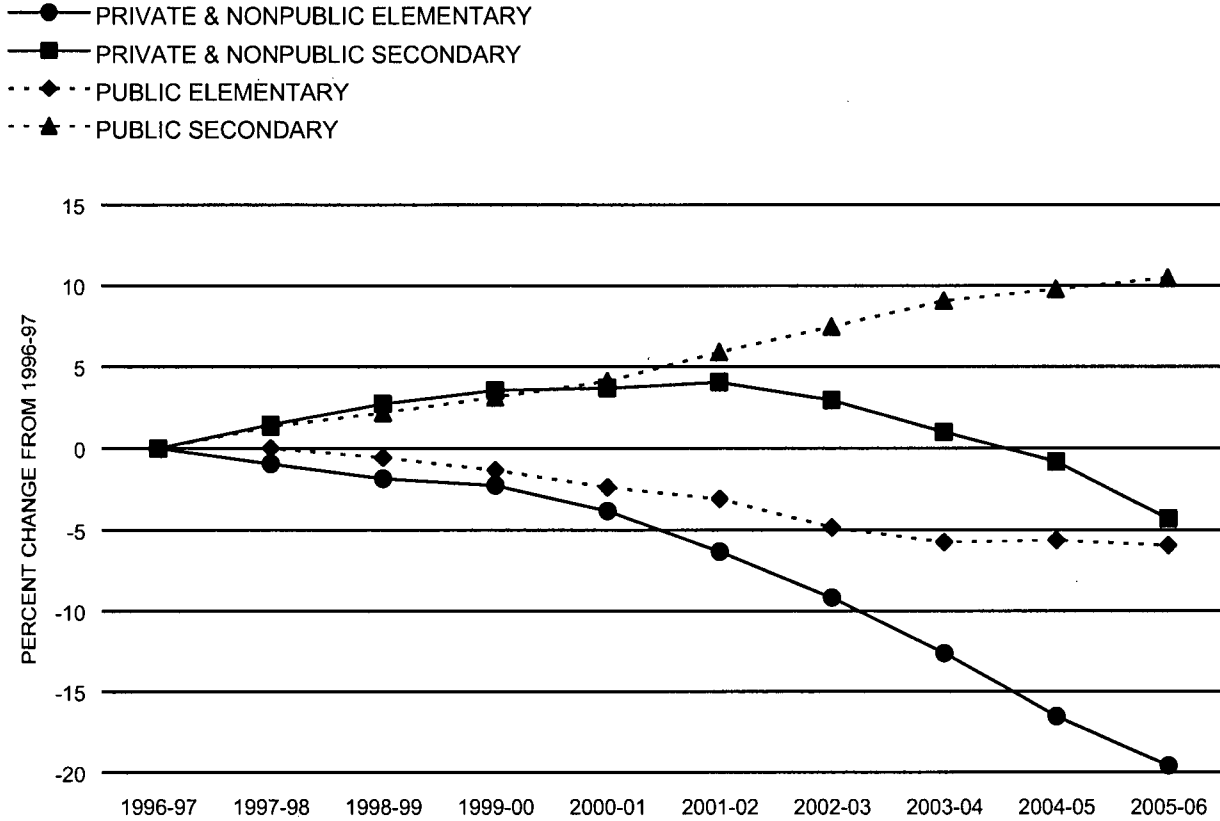

There were seven school districts (1.4%) with enrollments of 13,000 or more that comprised 17.1% of the total enrollments. At the other end of the spectrum, 62 school districts (12.4%) had less than 1,000 enrollments and comprised 2.7% of the total enrollments. Almost half of the school districts had enrollments between 1,000 and 2,999. The most frequently reported enrollment was between 1,000 and 1,999.

In the short term, public secondary enrollments will continue to increase, while public elementary enrollments will continue to decline. Projected through 2015, Pennsylvania public enrollments will decrease. Nationally, public enrollments are projected to decrease in the Northeast and Midwest, and increase in the South and West.

Pennsylvania's proportion of students in private and nonpublic schools declined from 15.6% in 1996-97 to 13.3% in 2005-06. Enrollment in private and nonpublic schools in the state is projected to continue to decrease through 2010-11. Nationally, projections to 2015 show small increases in private and nonpublic enrollments.

Total enrollments in 2005-06 decreased for the fourth consecutive year, while elementary enrollments decreased for the ninth consecutive year. Since 1996-97, secondary enrollments have increased yearly.

Public enrollments increased 1.5%, and public secondary enrollments increased 10.5% between 1996-97 and 2005-06. Over the same period, public elementary enrollments had a 6.0% decrease.

Private and nonpublic enrollments continued an overall decline from 1996-97 to 2005-06. Elementary enrollments declined every year, with a 19.6% decrease from 1996-97 to 2005-06. Secondary enrollments had a 4.3% decrease during this period.

Since 1996-97, the number of public schools showed an overall increase of 2.3%. During the same period, the number of public elementary schools decreased 7.6%, while secondary schools increased 0.3%, an increase of two schools. Combined elementary/secondary schools showed an increase of 45.9%.

Over the past decade, the number of private and nonpublic schools decreased 2.4%. The number of elementary/secondary schools decreased 14.1%. The number of private and nonpublic schools with strictly elementary enrollments increased 0.5%. Those with strictly secondary enrollments increased 7.4% since 1996-97.

Overall, the total number of schools increased 0.2% between 1996-97 and 2005-06. Elementary/Secondary schools increased 13.2%, secondary schools increased 1.3% and elementary schools decreased 3.7%.

A local educational agency (LEA) can contain multiple schools. Several types of LEAs made up Pennsylvania's total public enrollment. School districts and charter schools comprised 95.7% and 3.0%, respectively, of that total. Charter school enrollments continued to grow as the number of charter schools increased.

The number and percentage of enrollments for all minority categories increased since 1996-97. Black and Hispanic showed the largest increases. The largest percentage point increases were in the Hispanic category, where elementary enrollments increased by 3.1 and secondary enrollments by 2.4. Minorities comprised 26.9% of the 931,415 elementary and 23.6% of the 899,269 secondary enrollments in 2005-06, compared to 21.2% and 18.2% in 1996-97.

Compared to total public enrollments, which consisted of 25.2% minorities, enrollments for the 116 charter schools were 60.3% minorities. Most charter schools are located in urban areas with high concentrations of minorities. Overall, 53.7% of charter school students were enrolled at the elementary level.

Of the private and nonpublic schools, 75.6% had a religious affiliation, and 24.4% were secular. Non-Catholic religious schools comprised 49.5% of the private and nonpublic schools, and Catholic schools accounted for 26.1%.

Of the students in private and nonpublic schools, 61.4% were enrolled in Catholic schools. The Catholic schools comprised 62.5% of the elementary enrollments and 58.4% of the secondary enrollments.

APPENDIX F

GLOSSARY

CHARTER SCHOOL - An independent public school, established and operated under a charter from the local board of school directors, in which students are enrolled or attend. A charter school must be organized as a public nonprofit corporation. Charter schools are exempt from most state mandates except those insuring the health, safety and civil rights of students.

COMPREHENSIVE AVTS - A school that enrolls secondary students and provides a total educational program and services for both specialized career and technical education and academic education.

CONSORTIUM-OPERATED ALTERNATIVE HIGH SCHOOL - A school formed as a result of a special program jointure that enrolls high-risk students or students who previously dropped out. A special program jointure is an entity established by the boards of school directors in two or more school districts, with the approval of the Pennsylvania Department of Education, under Sections 1701-1709 of the Public School Code of 1949, as amended.

ELEMENTARY - A school which includes only elementary-level students (normally grades PreK-6 for public schools and grades K-8 for private and nonpublic schools).

ELEMENTARY/SECONDARY - A school that includes both elementary- and secondary-level students.

LOCAL EDUCATION AGENCY (LEA) - A board of education or other legally constituted local school authority having administrative control and direction of public elementary or secondary schools in a city, county, township, school district or political subdivision in a state, or any other public educational institution or agency having administrative control and direction of a career and technical education program.

NONPUBLIC SCHOOL - A school that is privately controlled by a nonpublic entity and is financed from sources other than public taxation.

OCCUPATIONAL AVTS - A school that enrolls secondary students and provides an educational program and services for only specialized career and technical education.

PRE-KINDERGARTEN (PREK) - A program enrolling students who are up to two years younger than the entrance age for the local education agency's kindergarten program.

PRIVATE SCHOOL - A nonpublic school defined by the licensing regulations as one that maintains or conducts classes for the purpose of offering instruction for consideration, profit or tuition, to five or more students at one time, or to 25 or more students during the school year.

RACIAL/ETHNIC CATEGORIES - Categories used to describe groups to which individuals belong, identify with or belong in the eyes of the community. These categories do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. However, no person may be counted in more than one racial/ethnic category.

AMERICAN INDIAN/ALASKAN NATIVE - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America and who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

ASIAN/PACIFIC ISLANDER - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian subcontinent or Pacific Islands. This includes people from China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, Samoa, India and Vietnam.

BLACK (NON-HISPANIC) - A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa (except those of Hispanic origin).

HISPANIC - A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

WHITE (NON-HISPANIC) - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa or the Middle East (except those of Hispanic origin).

SCHOOL - A division of a school system comprised of one or more grade groups, organized as one unit usually under the direction of a principal or a head teacher. Thus, one building may house more than one school or one school may occupy all or part of one or more buildings.

SECONDARY - A school that includes only secondary-level students (normally grades 7-12 for public schools and grades 9-12 for private and nonpublic schools).
