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OVERVIEW

This publication provides a compilation of statistical information covering enrollments in Pennsylvania public, private and nonpublic schools. Public schools totaled 3,246 which included: 15 comprehensive area vocational-technical schools (AVTSs), 65 occupational AVTSs, 65 charter schools, four consortium-operated alternative high schools, 12 juvenile correctional institutions, two stateowned schools and 3,083 schools in school districts. There were 2,474 private and nonpublic schools. This publication contains a variety of information including total enrollments by grade and county, the religious affiliation of private and nonpublic schools and the number of elementary and secondary schools.

The source of this data is an annual survey of all Pennsylvania public, private and nonpublic schools. National data was drawn from the results of surveys conducted by the U.S. Department of Education, National Center for Education Statistics (NCES).


DISTRIBUTION OF PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS BY ENROLLMENT SIZE 2000-01

There were seven school districts (1.4%) with enrollments of 13,000 or more that comprised 17.8% of the total enrollments. At the other end of the spectrum, 51 school districts (10.2%) had less than 1,000 enrollments and comprised 2.2% of the total enrollments. Over half of the school districts had enrollments between 1,000 and 2,999. The most frequently reported enrollment was between 1,000 and 1,999.

Public enrollments continued their growth throughout the past decade. Projections to 2004-05 indicate that public secondary enrollments will continue to increase, while public elementary enrollments will continue to decline.

Private and nonpublic enrollments declined after their peak year in 1994-95. Since 1993-94, elementary enrollments declined every year, while secondary enrollments increased.

PUBLIC, PRIVATE AND NONPUBLIC ENROLLMENTS 1991-92 THROUGH 2000-01

Total enrollments in 2000-01 marked a decline for the second consecutive year. This decline was a result of elementary enrollments decreasing for the fourth consecutive year. Since 1991-92, secondary enrollments have increased yearly.

Pennsylvania's proportion of students in private and nonpublic schools has declined from 16.6% in 1991-92 to 15.3% in 2000-01. This trend is projected to continue in the state through 2004-05, contrary to national projections which show private and nonpublic enrollments remaining stable nationwide.

PUBLIC, PRIVATE AND NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS BY SELECTED YEARS

Since 1991-92, the number of public schools decreased by 0.2%. During the same period, the number of public elementary schools steadily decreased, while public secondary and combined elementary/secondary schools fluctuated but showed an overall increase of 0.2% and 13.6%, respectively.

Over the past decade, the number of private and nonpublic schools increased by 7.0%. This overall increase in private and nonpublic schools was a result of the increase in elementary and elementary/secondary schools. The number of private and nonpublic schools with strictly secondary enrollments decreased since 1991-92.

PUBLIC ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY ENROLLMENTS BY RACE 1991-92 AND 2000-01

The number and percentage of enrollments for all minority categories increased since 1991-92. Black and Hispanic showed the largest increases. The largest percentage point increases in elementary enrollments occurred for black (2.6) and in secondary enrollments for Hispanic (1.3). Minorities comprised 23.5% of elementary and 19.8% of secondary enrollments compared to 18.6% and 16.9%, respectively, in 1991-92.

Enrollments for the 65 charter schools consisted of 70.2% minorities, including 75.5% of elementary and 63.1% of secondary enrollments. Most charter schools are located in urban areas with high concentrations of minorities. Overall, 58.1% of charter school students were enrolled at the elementary level.

PRIVATE AND NONPUBLIC SCHOOL ENROLLMENTS BY RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION AND LEVEL 2000-01

Of students in private and nonpublic schools, 64.6% were enrolled in a Catholic school. Further, Catholic schools comprised 66.8% of elementary enrollments and 58.1% of secondary enrollments.

Non-Catholic religious schools comprised 47.4% of the private and nonpublic schools, and secular schools comprised 24.5%. Catholic schools accounted for 28.1% of the private and nonpublic schools.

APPENDIX F

GLOSSARY

- CHARTER SCHOOL An independent public school established and operated under a charter from the local board of school directors and in which students are enrolled or attend. A charter school must be organized as a public nonprofit corporation. Charter schools are exempt from most state mandates except those insuring the health, safety and civil rights of students.
- COMPREHENSIVE AVTS A school that enrolls secondary students and provides a total educational program and services for both specialized career and technical education and academic education.
- CONSORTIUM-OPERATED ALTERNATIVE HIGH SCHOOL A school formed as a result of a special program jointure which enrolls high-risk students or students who previously dropped out. A special program jointure is an entity established by the boards of school directors in two or more school districts, with the approval of the Pennsylvania Department of Education, under Sections 1701-1709 of the Public School Code of 1949, as amended.
- ELEMENTARY A school which includes only elementary-level students (normally grades K-6 for public schools and grades K-8 for private and nonpublic schools).
- ELEMENTARY/SECONDARY A school which includes both elementary- and secondary-level students.
- LOCAL EDUCATION AGENCY A board of education or other legally constituted local school authority having administrative control and direction of public elementary or secondary schools in a city, county, township, school district or political subdivision in a state, or any other public educational institution or agency having administrative control and direction of a career and technical education program.
- NONPUBLIC SCHOOL A school that is privately controlled by a nonpublic entity and is financed from sources other than public taxation.
- OCCUPATIONAL AVTS A school that enrolls secondary students and provides an educational program and services for only specialized career and technical education.
- PRIVATE SCHOOL A nonpublic school defined by the licensing regulations as one that maintains or conducts classes for the purpose of offering instruction for consideration, profit or tuition, to five or more students at one time, or to 25 or more students during the school year.
- RACIAL/ETHNIC CATEGORIES Categories used to describe groups to which individuals belong, identify with or belong in the eyes of the community. These categories do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. However, no person may be counted in more than one racial/ethnic category.

AMERICAN INDIAN/ALASKAN NATIVE - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America and who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

ASIAN/PACIFIC ISLANDER - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian subcontinent or Pacific Islands. This includes people from China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, Samoa, India and Vietnam.

BLACK (NON-HISPANIC) - A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa (except those of Hispanic origin).

HISPANIC - A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

WHITE (NON-HISPANIC) - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa or the Middle East (except those of Hispanic origin).

SCHOOL - A division of a school system comprised of one or more grade groups, organized as one unit usually under the direction of a principal or a head teacher. Thus, one building may house more than one school or one school may occupy all or part of one or more buildings.

SECONDARY - A school which includes only secondary-level students (normally grades 7-12 for public schools and grades 9-12 for private and nonpublic schools).
