

The purpose of this modification is to revise "NRC General Provisions for Grants and Cooperative Agreements Awarded to Institutions of Higher Education," Section 28b., replacing the Scholarship and Fellowship Program Service Agreement incorporated as Attachment No. 1, in Modification No. 001, with the revised Scholarship and Fellowship Program Service Agreement. Accordingly, the grant is modified as follows:

Under Section 28b., Attachment No. 1 is replaced with the revised Scholarship and Fellowship Program Service Agreement, which is hereby incorporated as Attachment No. 1 - Revision No. 1, to the award document.

All other terms and conditions of this grant remain the same.

A summary of obligations, from the award date through the date of this action, is given below:

Scholarship and Fellowship Program Service Agreement

1. This service agreement is required for all recipients of scholarships or fellowships (hereinafter referred to as the "recipient") funded by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) through the University of _____.
2. This agreement confirms the recipient's obligations to maintain satisfactory academic progress, accept any offer of employment with the NRC in the field for which the scholarship or fellowship was awarded, and complete a specified period of service with NRC.
3. The scholarship recipient must: (check here if scholarship)
 - a. remain matriculated in the degree program for the field of study for which the scholarship was approved,
 - b. maintain satisfactory academic progress in the recipient's field of study, as demonstrated by maintaining a 3.5 Grade Point Average both overall and within the recipient's major, and
 - c. maintain a course load of at least 12 credit hours per semester as a full-time student in good standing.
4. The fellowship recipient must: (check here if fellowship)
 - a. maintain a 3.6 GPA overall and within a field of study
 - b. maintain a course load of at least 9 credit hours per semester and be classified as a full time student
 - c. remain matriculated in the degree program for the field of study for which the fellowship was approved.
5. If a recipient fails to maintain satisfactory academic progress, the scholarship or fellowship will be terminated and the recipient must repay the NRC the full amount of the scholarship/fellowship.
6. A minimum of 90 days before completion of the academic degree in connection with which the scholarship or fellowship was provided, the recipient must contact the NRC Grants Program Manager, immediately accept employment, if offered, with the NRC, and complete all required pre-appointment processes. Employment is at the convenience of the NRC; receipt of a scholarship or fellowship does not guarantee employment. An offer of employment is contingent, among other things, upon satisfactory completion of pre-appointment processing leading to an NRC security clearance.
7. If the recipient is offered employment, this agreement obligates the recipient to serve with the NRC for a period equal to 1 calendar year for each full or partial academic year of education sponsored in whole or in part by the scholarship/fellowship.

8. If a recipient receives any subsequent scholarship(s) or fellowship(s) through this program, the service obligation periods will be consecutive.
9. At the discretion of the NRC, the service obligation period may be delayed to allow the recipient to continue a subsequent degree program immediately following that sponsored under this program. For example, a recipient who receives a fellowship to earn a Master's degree, may request and be permitted to delay fulfilling their service obligation to the NRC until after they complete a subsequent terminal degree program. Any such requests must be made to the NRC before a student enrolls in a subsequent degree program. If a student enrolls in a subsequent degree program before or without NRC approval, and the NRC does not subsequently approve the request, the NRC will not be held liable for any expenses incurred to dis-enroll, or for failure to otherwise meet the terms of this service obligation. Recipients only incur a service obligation to NRC for funded periods of study.
10. If a recipient voluntarily leaves the NRC during the period of obligated post-academic service, the recipient immediately becomes liable to the U.S. Government for repayment of the entire amount of the assistance provided under the scholarship or fellowship plus any applicable interest at a rate determined by the Commission in accordance with standard Federal debt collection procedures (See 10 C.F.R. Part 15).
11. The recipient understands that his or her last pay check and any lump sum payment for annual leave and other payment due on separation will be applied toward this debt without further notice. If the recipient's last pay check and any lump sum payment do not satisfy the debt, the recipient may pay the balance of the debt in full or set up a repayment plan.
12. This agreement will be cancelled and right of recovery waived if:
 - a. NRC does not offer employment,
 - b. the recipient is separated involuntarily for reasons other than misconduct or delinquency, or
 - c. the recipient separates for other reasons fully acceptable to NRC.
13. By signing this agreement, the recipient certifies that he or she has read this agreement and agrees to all of the obligations it entails.
