SUBJECT: REPORT ON FEDERAL ARCHEOLOGY PROGRAM ACTIVITIES-2007

This responds to your January 24, 2008 email requesting participation in reporting to Congress on the archeological activities that the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) conducted or required in FY 2007.

Following the guidelines as set forth in the instructions for the questionnaire, we have reviewed only Sections A through I. We have no data to report with regard to Listing of Outlaw Treachery (LOOT) records. Enclosed you will find the NRC's completed questionnaire and supplemental narrative responses.

The NRC does not have Federal land management responsibilities and, therefore, does not directly engage in maintaining or restoring archaeological or historic properties that may be identified during the environmental review process for issuing permits or licenses. However, NRC licensees are required to take the mitigative measures necessary to protect such properties. As a regulatory agency, NRC does not incur any direct costs associated with the protection or enhancement of archaeological and historic resources. Enclosure 1 is the archeological report spreadsheet. Enclosure 2 is the clarification to D7.

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Clarification to Section D7:

1. Southern Nuclear Operating Company (SNC), the applicant for the Vogtle Electric Generating Plant Early Site Permit (Vogtle ESP), submitted its application on August 15, 2006. SNC assessed the impact on known and potential historic and cultural resources and classified site lands according to resource potential. In addition, SNC included cultural resource-specific written directions in its site-wide Excavation and Backfill Work Procedures calling for an immediate stop work order should archaeological, historic, or other cultural resources be discovered during excavation. In November 2006, the staff visited Plant Hatch, Plant Farley and the Barton Site, the three alternate sites identified in the Vogtle ESP submittal. The staff toured the site and the surrounding vicinity and met with personnel.

A draft environmental impact statement (DEIS) was issued for public comment on September 14, 2007. Copies of the DEIS were forwarded to the Georgia Department of Natural Resources (GaDNR) and to Native American tribes which may have an aboriginal interest in the site for review. GaDNR provided comments on the DEIS and stated that additional investigation was needed into a listed site at the Vogtle ESP.
