- I, R. Scott Clayton, Esquire, of full age, do hereby certify as follows:
- I am an attorney with the law firm Berry, Sahradnik, Kotzas & Benson, counsel for the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders, and am fully familiar with the facts underlying this lawsuit.
- 2. This lawsuit involves the decision of the NRC rejecting the contention of the State of New Jersey that the National Environmental Protetion Act (NEPA) requires the preparation of an environmental impact statement (EIS) to consider the

- impacts of an air attack on the Oyster Creek nuclear power generating facility.
- 3. The Oyster Creek facility is located in the Township of Lacey, which is situated in the County of Ocean.
- 4. The moving party, the Ocean County Board of Chosen

 Freeholders has an interest in the safe and efficient

 operations of the Oyster Creek facility because it involves

 the safety, health, and welfare of the residents of Ocean

 County, New Jersey.
- 5. The within motion is filed pursuant to Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 29(b), which allows amicus curiae to seek leave of the Court to proceed as such.
- 6. In addition to seeking leave to proceed as amicus curiae, the within motion seeks an extension of time within which to file the amicus brief.
- 7. Specifically, the moving party seeks an extension of at least seven (7) days from the date of the order granting the within application to file its amicus curiae brief.
 - 8. The reason for the application for an extension of time is that the undersigned was unaware of the due date for Petitioners' brief and was therefore not able to calculate the due date for amicus curiae brief under the Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 29(e).
