PROGRAM SUMMARY:

The ANO annual random testing rate is 50 percent. During this reporting period, approximately 25.76 percent of the population has been randomly tested. The rate of positive tests from random testing is 0 percent. The total random percentage for the year is 52.70 percent.

POSITIVE RESULTS:

During the 6 month period, employees and contractors submitted 614 samples for collection and testing. Four confirmed positive for illegal drugs. No individuals refused to submit to testing.

MANAGEMENT ACTIONS:

During the reporting period two supplemental personnel tested positive for marijuana and one supplemental personnel tested positive for cocaine during pre-access testing. All three individuals were denied unescorted access. One contract personnel's unescorted access was revoked when they tested positive for amphetamines during random testing.

EVENTS REPORTED TO THE NRC:

During this reporting period, there were no violations of the fitness for duty program that were reportable.

PROGRAM EVALUATION:

No programmatic problems were identified during this reporting period.
