Subject: Transmittal of Proprietary Information, AP1000 Containment Recirculation and IRWST Screen Design

In support of the NRC Acceptance Review of the AP1000 request for Design Certification Amendment (AP1000 Design Control Document, Revision 16), Westinghouse is submitting report APP-GW-GLN-147 Revision 0, "AP1000 Containment Recirculation and IRWST Screen Design," Westinghouse Proprietary. The purpose of this document is to address the DCD Revision 16 Acceptance Issue to provide screen design documentation. NRC has identified that the information provided in AP1000 DCD Revision 16 and the document APP-GW-GLR-079, Revision 2, "AP1000 Verification of Water Sources for Long Term Recirculation Cooling Following a Loss-of-Coolant Accident," is insufficient to resolve COL Information Item 6.3-2.

The report submitted herein provides additional design detail of the AP1000 Incontainment Refueling Water Storage Tank (IRWST) screens and the Containment Recirculation screens to allow a safety evaluation of the acceptability of the design to be performed. In addition to providing more screen design detail, this report provides references to Design Control Document (DCD) figures and text, other previously transmitted Technical Reports, and to relevant DSER Open Item Responses that provide information about the AP1000 long term cooling design and performance evaluations. This additional design information supplements the information previously provided in DCD Revision 16 and APP-GW-GLR-079, Revision 2.

The AP1000 DCD is revised to include a reference to APP-GW-GLN-147 in Sections 6.3.2.2.7.2, 6.3.2.2.7.3 and 6.3.9.

In addition, Westinghouse is revising DCD Revision 16 Section 6.3.8.2 to add the following COL holder item to address the additional test and analyses issues requested by the NRC.

- A Combined License holder referencing the AP1000 design will provide an assessment of the acceptability of the screen performance by performing testing and analysis of the screens. Downstream effects will be assessed to confirm the coolability of the core.

These items require the selection of a specific screen to complete the testing and analyses. Per the guidance provided in Regulatory Guide 1.206, Section CIII.4.3, Item (3), COL applicants referencing the AP1000 design certification amendment application will include License Conditions to provide the

Additional testing, analysis, and evaluation results to address the confirmation that the specific screen provides sufficient margin to the AP1000 safety limits. In addition, resolution of GSI 191 is still evolving within the industry, thereby further substantiating the definition of these items as COL License holder issues resulting in License Conditions.

COL Information Item Table, DCD Table 1.8-2 provided in DCD Revision 16 currently identifies a COL Holder item being required. However, APP-GW-GLR 134, Revision 0 deleted this requirement. Table 1.8-2 requires a revision back to reinstate the COL Holder item for COL Information Item 6.3-2.

The DCD revised pages are provided in APP-GW-GLR-134, Revision 2, "AP1000 DCD Impacts to Support COLA Standardization," transmitted in DCP/NRC2069, Andrea Sterdis to Nuclear Regulatory Commission, dated January 11, 2008.

Enclosed is one copy of the Application for Withholding, AW-07-2371 (non-proprietary) with Proprietary Information Notice, and one copy of the associated Affidavit (non-proprietary).

This submittal contains proprietary information of Westinghouse Electric Company, LLC. In conformance with the requirements of 10 CFR Section 2.390, as amended, of the Commission's regulations, we are enclosing with this submittal an Application for Withholding from Public Disclosure and an affidavit. The affidavit sets forth the basis on which the information identified as proprietary may be withheld from public disclosure by the Commission.

Pursuant to 10 CFR 50.30(b), APP-GW-GLN-147, Revision 0, "AP1000 Containment Recirculation and IRWST Screen Design," Technical Report Number 147, is submitted as Enclosure 1 under the attached Oath of Affirmation.

The additional design information provided in this technical report, along with the DCD revisions to DCD Sections 6.3.2.2.7.2, 6.3.2.2.7.3, 6.3.9 and 6.3.8.2 provided in APP-GW-GLR-134, Revision 2 are expected to be sufficient to address the acceptance and docketing issues raised by the NRC regarding COL Information Item 6.3-2 and the containment recirculation and IRWST screen design.






- (1) I am Manager, Standardization and Configuration Management, Westinghouse Electric Company, LLC (Westinghouse), and as such, I have been specifically delegated the function of reviewing the proprietary information sought to be withheld from public disclosure in connection with nuclear power plant licensing and rule making proceedings, and am authorized to apply for its withholding on behalf of Westinghouse.
- (2) I am making this Affidavit in conformance with the provisions of 10 CFR Section 2.390 of the Commission's regulations and in conjunction with the Westinghouse "Application for Withholding" accompanying this Affidavit.
- (3) I have personal knowledge of the criteria and procedures utilized by Westinghouse in designating information as a trade secret, privileged or as confidential commercial or financial information.
- (4) Pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (b)(4) of Section 2.390 of the Commission's regulations, the following is furnished for consideration by the Commission in determining whether the information sought to be withheld from public disclosure should be withheld.
  - (i) The information sought to be withheld from public disclosure is owned and has been held in confidence by Westinghouse.
  - (ii) The information is of a type customarily held in confidence by Westinghouse and not customarily disclosed to the public. Westinghouse has a rational basis for determining the types of information customarily held in confidence by it and, in that connection, utilizes a system to determine when and whether to hold certain types of information in confidence. The application of that system and the substance of that system constitutes Westinghouse policy and provides the rational basis required.

Under that system, information is held in confidence if it falls in one or more of several types, the release of which might result in the loss of an existing or potential competitive advantage, as follows:

    - (a) The information reveals the distinguishing aspects of a process (or component, structure, tool, method, etc.) where prevention of its use by any of Westinghouse's competitors without license from Westinghouse constitutes a competitive economic advantage over other companies.

- (b) It consists of supporting data, including test data, relative to a process (or component, structure, tool, method, etc.), the application of which data secures a competitive economic advantage, e.g., by optimization or improved marketability.
- (c) Its use by a competitor would reduce his expenditure of resources or improve his competitive position in the design, manufacture, shipment, installation, assurance of quality, or licensing a similar product.
- (d) It reveals cost or price information, production capacities, budget levels, or commercial strategies of Westinghouse, its customers or suppliers.
- (e) It reveals aspects of past, present, or future Westinghouse or customer funded development plans and programs of potential commercial value to Westinghouse.
- (f) It contains patentable ideas, for which patent protection may be desirable.

There are sound policy reasons behind the Westinghouse system which include the following:

- (a) The use of such information by Westinghouse gives Westinghouse a competitive advantage over its competitors. It is, therefore, withheld from disclosure to protect the Westinghouse competitive position.
- (b) It is information that is marketable in many ways. The extent to which such information is available to competitors diminishes the Westinghouse ability to sell products and services involving the use of the information.
- (c) Use by our competitor would put Westinghouse at a competitive disadvantage by reducing his expenditure of resources at our expense.
- (d) Each component of proprietary information pertinent to a particular competitive advantage is potentially as valuable as the total competitive advantage. If competitors acquire components of proprietary information, any one component

may be the key to the entire puzzle, thereby depriving Westinghouse of a competitive advantage.

- (e) Unrestricted disclosure would jeopardize the position of prominence of Westinghouse in the world market, and thereby give a market advantage to the competition of those countries.
  - (f) The Westinghouse capacity to invest corporate assets in research and development depends upon the success in obtaining and maintaining a competitive advantage.
- (iii) The information is being transmitted to the Commission in confidence and, under the provisions of 10 CFR Section 2.390, it is to be received in confidence by the Commission.
- (iv) The information sought to be protected is not available in public sources or available information has not been previously employed in the same original manner or method to the best of our knowledge and belief.
- (v) The proprietary information sought to be withheld in this submittal is that which is appropriately marked in APP-GW-GLN-147 (Proprietary), in support of Combined License application pre-application activities for the NuStart Bellefonte COL Project being transmitted by Westinghouse letter (DCP/NRC2066) and Application for Withholding Proprietary Information from Public Disclosure, to the Document Control Desk. The proprietary information as submitted by Westinghouse for the AP1000 NuStart Bellefonte plant is expected to be applicable in other licensee submittals in response to certain NRC requirements for justification of compliance of the safety system to regulations.

This information is part of that which will enable Westinghouse to:

- (a) Manufacture and deliver products to utilities based on proprietary designs.
- (b) Advance the AP1000 Design and reduce the licensing risk for the application of the AP1000 Design Certification

- (c) Determine compliance with regulations and standards
- (d) Establish design requirements and specifications for the system.

Further this information has substantial commercial value as follows:

- (a) Westinghouse plans to sell the use of similar information to its customers for purposes of plant construction and operation.
- (b) Westinghouse can sell support and defense of safety systems based on the technology in the reports.
- (c) The information requested to be withheld reveals the distinguishing aspects of an approach and schedule which was developed by Westinghouse.

Public disclosure of this proprietary information is likely to cause substantial harm to the competitive position of Westinghouse because it would enhance the ability of competitors to provide similar digital technology safety systems and licensing defense services for commercial power reactors without commensurate expenses. Also, public disclosure of the information would enable others to use the information to meet NRC requirements for licensing documentation without purchasing the right to use the information.

The development of the technology described in part by the information is the result of applying the results of many years of experience in an intensive Westinghouse effort and the expenditure of a considerable sum of money.

In order for competitors of Westinghouse to duplicate this information, similar technical programs would have to be performed and a significant manpower effort, having the requisite talent and experience, would have to be expended.
