MEMO TO THE FILES

TELEPHONE CONVERSATION WITH AL GILLMAN, NUCLEAR METALS INC., CONCORD, MASS.,
JANUARY 9, 1974 AT 12 NOON

In a telephone conversation with Mr. Gillman, I asked him if all the employees cars that had been found contaminated were going to be cleaned by Nuclear Metals, he stated that the automobiles would be cleaned before the end of the day, January 9, 1974. I discussed with Mr. Gillman the matter of whole body counting of employees who had a likelihood of exposure to airborne concentration of the contaminated materials. I noted that it appeared based on smears that Mr. Jerman had taken the week before that whole body counting would be practical. I pointed out to him that there were two whole body counters located in MIT and noted that he had previously mentioned whole body counting. I asked him if he intended to do any, in reply he stated that although he could not specify the number of employees would be involved, the company did intend to perform whole body counting and that he would pass the results of the whole body counting on to me.
