LICENSE CONDITIONS

10. The authorized place of use is the licensee's address stated in Item 2. The licensee must notify the Radiological Health Program 30 days prior to vacating a permanent use address as is required by Section D.1301 of COMAR 26.12.01.01.
- 11A. The radiation protection program shall be under the supervision of William L. Higgins, M.D.
- 11B. Radioactive material shall be used by, or under the supervision of:
 - Jefferson E.C. Moulds M.D.
 - Anatoly Dritchilo M.D.
 - Sanjeev Aggarwal, M.D.
12. The licensee shall comply with all appropriate provisions of COMAR 26.12.01.01 "Regulations for Control of Ionizing Radiation."
13. Sealed sources containing radioactive material shall not be opened.
14. The licensee shall conduct a physical inventory every three (3) months to account for all sealed sources received and possessed under the license. The records of the inventories shall be maintained for two (2) years from the date of the inventory for inspection by the Department, and shall include the quantities and kinds of radioactive material, location of sealed sources, and the date of the inventory.
15. Food and beverage containers shall not be discarded in radioactive or normal trash containers in licensee's areas utilizing radioactive materials.
