

<p><b>10 CFR 35.40(a) requires, in part, that a written directive must be dated and signed by an authorized user before the administration of I-131 sodium iodide greater than 30 microcuries.</b></p> <p><b>Contrary to the above, a written directive was not signed by an authorized user. Specifically, on May 19, 2006, the licensee administered 4 millicuries of I-131 sodium iodide to a patient and the written directive was signed and dated by a physician who is not authorized for that procedure.</b></p>			
<b>Licensee's Statement of Corrective Actions for Item 4, above.</b>
