Hi Doug, regarding the documents, we post the NOV's on our web page, and the Settlement Agreements once they are signed, so post away. They are posted quarterly, but there is no need to wait for the DEQ posting. Regarding the investigation report, it is a public document, so there is no reason why you cannot post it too. We will send you a copy of the Settlement Agreement once it is signed by everyone - which will be a while since we haven't even had a meeting with PRI yet.

Now it is my turn with a question. I see the LQD correspondence, reviews, etc regarding uranium. Sometimes they are copied to NRC and sometimes not. I just saw a review for Lost Creek where the operator is balking at providing us with information they say is NRC jurisdiction. We disagree with their jurisdiction call and also our position is that the permits should be the same. It seems you would be interested in seeing these reviews.

So - questions:

1. Do you want us to copy you?
2. Can you send me a list of who we should copy for the various permits, including mailing and email addresses and phone numbers?

I think everyone already knows, but just to be safe, I will circulate contact info.

3. Are we copied or updated on the status/content of your reviews? It seems we should be doing that too.

Also, is it this week or next week that you are doing PRI inspections?

We received a copy of the NOV in the mail yesterday - thanks for sending that along. We've currently got a request for additional information in to PRI related to some of the surety issues that are identified in Mark's report. We've asked PRI to respond by March 31.

One question that I have relates to the public availability of this document. I would like to add the cover letter, NOV, and investigation report into our document management system as publically available documents. Will this create any problems or issues for you? In the past, we have made NOV's public, but there typically was not an investigation report. I can make the documents non publicly available, or I can delay the availability until they are available on the DEQ website. Any thoughts or comments from LQD would be welcome.
