
Re: Energy Solutions' import license application

I want to express my support for Energy Solutions' import application. My concern is that the application could be rejected based on emotional and political concerns or pressures. I hope that commission's decision will be based on scientific facts, which indicate the material can be safely stored.

The governor, other state and federal elected officials frequently emphasize how important it is for our Utah State businesses, to think in terms of doing business on a global basis. But when it comes to waste material, it is obvious that they (the elected officials) only mean global, when it is politically popular. Also, if they weren't so concerned about getting re-elected, they would be emphasizing the most important issues, such as safety. And also they would be pointing out the benefits of jobs and revenue that Energy Solutions provides for the benefit of both the State of Utah and Tooele County.
