

NRC/MARYLAND MEETING - NPI ISSUES

PROPOSED AGENDA

1. Maryland's plan to obtain NPI corrective action or program improvements for violations or program weaknesses, such as the ineffective RSO, identified in the inspection report issued on January 20, 1994, and which were not addressed in the court case settlement.
2. Actions already completed by the State of Maryland to assure corrective actions by NPI for those violations upheld by the court case settlement. (Copies of correspondence to/from NPI regarding enforcement issued since the court case settlement would be useful to review and discuss.)
3. Future actions planned by the State of Maryland to assure corrective action by NPI for those violations upheld by the court case settlement.
4. How the State of Maryland plans to assure NPI corrective actions or program improvements for violations or program weaknesses identified in the future.
5. The State of Maryland's strategy for assuring that NPI will comply with Maryland's equivalent of the new 10 CFR Part 20 and their equivalent of the decommissioning rule, when promulgated this year.
6. The identification of any assistance that NRC could provide to the State of Maryland to assure NPI corrective actions or program improvements.
