TASK ORDER TERMS AND CONDITIONS

NOT SPECIFIED IN THE CONTRACT

A.1 NRC Acquisition Clauses - (NRCAR) 48 CFR Ch. 20

A.2 SEAT BELTS

Contractors, subcontractors, and grantees, are encouraged to adopt and enforce on-the-job seat belt policies and programs for their employees when operating company-owned, rented, or personally owned vehicles.

A.3 WHISTLEBLOWER PROTECTION FOR NRC CONTRACTOR AND SUBCONTRACTOR EMPLOYEES (JULY 2006)

(a) The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) contractor and its subcontractor are subject to the Whistleblower Employee Protection public law provisions as codified at 42 U.S.C. 5851. NRC contractor(s) and subcontractor(s) shall comply with the requirements of this Whistleblower Employee Protection law, and the implementing regulations of the NRC and the Department of Labor (DOL). See, for example, DOL Procedures on Handling Complaints at 29 C.F.R. Part 24 concerning the employer obligations, prohibited acts, DOL procedures and the requirement for prominent posting of notice of Employee Rights at Appendix A to Part 24.

(b) Under this Whistleblower Employee Protection law, as implemented by regulations, NRC contractor and subcontractor employees are protected from discharge, reprisal, threats, intimidation, coercion, blacklisting or other employment discrimination practices with respect to compensation, terms, conditions or privileges of their employment because the contractor or subcontractor employee(s) has provided notice to the employer, refused to engage in unlawful practices, assisted in proceedings or testified on activities concerning alleged violations of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 (as amended) and the Energy Reorganization Act of 1974 (as amended).

(c) The contractor shall insert this or the substance of this clause in any subcontracts involving work performed under this contract.

In accordance with the task order procedures of Contract NRC-02-05-002, this definitizes Task Order No. 3. This effort shall be performed in accordance with the enclosed Statement of Work, and the terms and conditions of Contract NRC-02-05-002.

Period of Performance and Cost

Task Order No. 3 shall be in effect from April 3, 2008, through January 31, 2009, with a cost ceiling of \$54,399.00, provided Option Year Two of the base contract NRC-02-05-002 is exercised. The amount of \$52,433.00 represents the estimated reimbursable costs, and the amount of \$1,966.00 represents the fixed fee.

Price Schedule – A price schedule is attached.

Consideration and Obligation

This task order is funded with FY 2008 funds in the amount of \$53,391.00. This obligated amount may be unilaterally increased from time to time by the Contracting Officer by written modification to this task order. The obligated amount shall at no time exceed the task order ceiling. When and if the amount(s) paid and payable to the Contractor hereunder shall equal the obligated amount, the Contractor shall not be obligated to continue performance of the work unless and until the Contracting Officer shall increase the amount obligated with respect to this task order. Any work undertaken by the Contractor in excess of the obligated amount is done so at the Contractor's sole risk.

Key Personnel

The following individuals are considered to be essential to the successful performance of work hereunder: Paul Bailey, Craig Dean (Project Manager), Peter Shields, Joe Keithley, and Andrew Little. The Contractor agrees that such personnel shall not be removed from the effort under the task order without compliance with Contract Clause H.1, Key Personnel.

The issuance of Task Order No. 3 does not change any terms and conditions of the subject contract.
