SUBJECT: LICENSE RENEWAL

Please find enclosed Amendment No. 06 to NRC License No. 15-26978-01. **This amendment authorizes your license renewal for 10 years.** An environmental assessment for this action is not required, since this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR 51.22(c)(14)(vi).

**Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. Additionally, please review the source changers closely. Not all of the source changers were authorized for the respective sealed source(s) as requested, because I could not correlate the compatibility in the Sealed Source Device Registry (SSDR). If you have specific documentation from the manufacturer, please provide it and we can correct your license. Additionally, please note that I did not authorize Amersham Model A424-22 sealed source, because it is a cesium-137 sealed source and not iridium-192 as indicated in your request. If you see any errors or if you have any questions regarding your license renewal, please contact me at (817) 276-6552.**

Pursuant to NRC's RIS 2005-31, the enclosed materials license will not be made publicly available.

**Please note that by License Condition 14 you are required to comply with the requirements of the "Order Imposing Increased Controls" (ADAMS Accession No. ML053130183) published in the Federal Register on December 1, 2005 (70 FR 72128); and with the "Order Imposing Fingerprinting and Criminal History Records Check Requirements for Unescorted Access to Certain Radioactive Materials" (fingerprinting Order) (ADAMS Accession No. ML073230738) published in the Federal Register on December 13, 2007 (70 FR 70901).**

**This License Condition requires that you complete implementation of said requirements by the first day that radionuclides in quantities of concern are possessed at or above the limits specified in "Table 1: Radionuclides of Concern" contained within the fingerprinting Order, and notify, in writing, the Director, Office of Federal and State Materials and Environmental Management Programs, U.S. NRC, Washington, DC, 20555,**

**when you have completed the requirements of this License Condition. Our records indicate that you provided a response to the NRC dated November 22, 2005 for the increased controls and January 29, 2008 for the fingerprinting order and that you are currently implementing the Increased Control requirements.**

NRC expects licensees to conduct their programs with meticulous attention to detail and a high standard of compliance. Because of the serious consequences to employees and the public that can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, you must conduct your radiation safety program according to the conditions of your NRC license, representations made in your license application, and NRC regulations. In particular, note that you must:

1. Operate by NRC regulations 10 CFR Part 19, "Notices, Instructions and Reports to Workers: Inspection and Investigations," 10 CFR Part 20, "Standards for Protection Against Radiation," and other applicable regulations.
2. Notify NRC in writing of any change in mailing address.
3. By 10 CFR 30.36(d) and/or license condition, notify NRC, promptly, in writing, and request termination of the license:
  - a. When you decide to terminate all activities involving materials authorized under the license whether at the entire site or any separate building or outdoor area;
  - b. If you decide not to acquire or possess and use authorized material; or
  - c. When no principal activities under the license have been conducted for a period of 24 months.
4. Request and obtain a license amendment before you:
  - a. Change Radiation Safety Officers;
  - b. Order byproduct material in excess of the amount, radionuclide or form authorized on the license;
  - c. Add or change the areas or address(es) of use identified in the license application or on the license; or
  - d. Change the name or ownership of your organization.
5. Submit a complete renewal application or termination request at least 30 days before the expiration date on your license. You will receive a reminder notice approximately 90 days before the expiration date. Possession of radioactive material after your license expires is a violation of NRC regulations.

In addition, please note that NRC Form 313 requires the applicant, by signature, to verify that the applicant understands that all statements contained in the application are true and correct to the best of the applicant's knowledge. The signatory for the application should be the licensee or certifying official rather than a consultant. Since the NRC also accepts a letter requesting amendment of an NRC license, the signatory for such a request should also be the licensee or certifying official rather than a consultant.

NRC will periodically inspect your radiation safety program. Failure to conduct your program according to NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC may result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation; imposition of a civil penalty; or an order suspending, modifying, or revoking your license as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy.
