Dear Mr. Bishop:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 43 to your NRC Material License No. 13-19923-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that as discussed during our telephone conversation on May 1, 2008, we have not added Drs. Damera and Sharif as an authorized users at this time. In order for us to complete our review of Dr. Damera's qualifications, you will need to submit: 1) a copy of the Dr. Damera's CBNC certificate; and 2) a completed Preceptor Attestation (Part II to NRC Form 313A). Enclosed you will find a NRC Form 313A. In order to complete our review of Dr. Sharif's qualifications, please submit a current NRC Form 313A describing his training and experience. Specifically, the documentation that was submitted describing his training appeared to be deficient in the 700 hours of required classroom and laboratory training, and work experience.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.


You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. This ensures that potentially sensitive information is not made publicly available through ADAMS, the NRC's electronic document system. Pursuant to NRC's RIS 2005-31 and in accordance with 10 CFR 2.390, the enclosed license document is exempt from public disclosure because its disclosure to unauthorized individuals could present a security vulnerability.
