SUMMARY OF THE FEBRUARY 13, 2004 SECOND PUBLIC MEETING TO DISCUSS A DRAFT ORDER REGARDING

FATIGUE OF NUCLEAR FACILITY

PERSONNEL AT THE CATEGORY I FUEL CYCLE FACILITIES

(ADAMS ACCESSION NUMBER ML040510349)

On February 13, 2004, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff held a public meeting at NRC Headquarters with representatives from the Category I Fuel Cycle Facilities, specifically BWX Technologies (BWXT) and Nuclear Fuel Services (NFS). The purpose of this meeting was to discuss the Order the NRC intends to issue concerning fatigue of security force personnel to the these facilities related to matters outlined in the meeting agenda (Attachment 1). Attachment 2 lists the attendees at the February 13, 2004, meeting.

The meeting focused on the draft Order language (Attachments 3 and 4) and the following major issues were raised:

A new simplified option (individual total work-hour controls method) was introduced to
allow licensees to calculate work work hours, instead of utilizing the current
group work-hour controls averaging method, to reduce a potential unnecessary
regulatory burden. Additionally, the licensee will be required to state within its
procedures, which option it shall use to determine work hours.

2.	The staff implemented revision to the draft CMs to include two relaxations previously
	granted to the power reactor licensees. The revisions included: (1) exclude shift
	turnover time in the group work hour controls and; (2) allowing the average number of
	hours worked by personnel, during the actual conduct of
	not exceed 60 hours per week, excluding shift turnover time.

3. The Category I Fuel Cycle facilities discussed with the staff the possibility of submitting a guidance document, similar to that submitted with the power reactor Order on fatigue, that discusses implementation of this Order once the Order has gained approval from the Commission.

The attached documents were made available and discussed with the meeting attendees.
