Dear Dr. Chae:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 11 to your NRC Material License No. 21-32035-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold font**.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. Please note that, in adding Dr. Zarghami, I authorized him as you requested, for "the use of materials in 10 CFR 35.100." But in order to capture the restriction on his authorization to "cardiovascular clinical procedures" I included the letter dated February 7, 2008, in the "tie-down" condition, the last condition of your license, as this is the format we must now use for restricted authorizations.

And, although I found it unusual to request an authorized user for "the use of materials in 10 CFR 35.100, limited to cardiovascular clinical procedures," I assumed that is what you wanted. If your letter and request were in error, you may request another amendment.

At this time I also added new Condition Nos. 12 and 13 to reflect our current standard licensing format.


In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and its enclosure will be available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the Publicly Available Records (PARS) component of NRC's document system (ADAMS). The NRC's document system is accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html> (the Public Electronic Reading Room).

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.

Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
