It seems as though I б recall that there were something about the flights 7 were easier on Tuesday than Monday. And I think they 8 may be less expensive. 9 In any event, let me suggest that we do it on the 23rd and the 24th of July. 10 11 ALL: Okay. 12 JUDGE YOUNG: And then the only other 1.3 thing that I think we could do today is Crowe Butte 14 in their response on the site visit indicated that 15 there were some issues with regard to numbers of people and ultimately suggests that we have just 16 17 counsel for the parties. It didn't mentioned the 18 Oglala Sioux Tribe, but that was probably an oversight, correct? 19 20 MR. SMITH: Yes, that's fine. Correct. 21 JUDGE YOUNG: So if we had the Licensing 22 Board that would be four, staff, counsel and one 23 person would be three. Applicant, but you were 24 going to have your two tour guides. Are you 25 counting those in the --

1	MR. SMITH: In the 20, yes.
2	JUDGE YOUNG: Okay. So that would be
3	four from you?
4	MR. SMITH: Yes.
5	MR. FRANKEL: Your Honor. Dave Frankel.
6	I'm wondering are you including that one
7	representative from each of the petitioners and one
8	or two technical people from our side would also be
9	able to come?
10	JUDGE YOUNG: Well, the request that
1:1	they've made is that each party have counsel and one
12	other person. What I'm trying to do is count up how
13	many people we have and whether there's any leeway
14	there.
15	For the Oglala Sioux Tribe, you have two
16	counsel. Would both of you want to be attending?
17	MS. LORENA: It would probably be just
18	I.
19	JUDGE YOUNG: Okay. So just one person?
20	MS. LORENA: Yes.
21	JUDGE YOUNG: Let's see, that's eight,
22	twelve. That does appear to leave some leeway. If
23	the petitioners have your two counsel and you have
24	how many other people would you like to bring with
25	you, WNRC?

1	MS. LORENA: It would be just me.
2	MR. FRANKEL: I think WNRC would like
3	Buffalo Bruce and one technical person. And I
4	believe Owe Aku would like Debra White Plume and one
: 5	technical person.
6	JUDGE YOUNG: So four in addition to
7	yourself?
8	MR. FRANKEL: Yes. And Bruce Ellison.
9	So that's makes six altogether.
10	JUDGE YOUNG: Six? So that would be 18
11	people altogether as I'm counting, unless I'm
12	missing something.
13	You have two separate technical people
14	that you know of at this point?
15	MR. FRANKEL: Yes.
16	MR. SMITH: Your Honor, this is Tyson
17	Smith.
18	I guess it's not clear to me why each of
19	the petitioners needs to have needs to attend
20	themselves and have technical staff attend as well.
21	I think it's usually somewhat common practice to
22	have one person represent all of the petitioners
23	together. And I would support a technical person
24	along with that. But I guess I'm not sure I see the
25	need for five other people.

In the interests of

ľ 2 finding a reasonable solution, why don't we say that 3 if we want the second technical person, then Mr. 4 Ellison will give up his spot. So in other words, 5 you know, if you all can live with five spots for 6 us, that would be Ms. White Plume, Buffalo Bruce, 7 myself and two technical people or one technical 8 person and Mr. Ellison then I think that's a pretty 9 reasonable ratio. 10 11 12

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JUDGE YOUNG: Given that there's three petitioners, it seems that five total would be reasonable for the three petitioners. And that would cut the total down to 17 individuals. It's three less than the 20 that you suggested, Mr. Smith, right?

MR. FRANKEL:

MR. SMITH: But, yes, that was an absolute maximum. I mean I think that with five it's going to be a bit of a logistical challenge to make sure we can get everyone around in a half day or so. But I think we can probably manage that.

JUDGE YOUNG: Okay. Now, are there any other considerations with regard to the other concerns that Crowe Butte raised about the certain specifics having to do with the -- let' see, as far as the safety procedures. Obviously, I think

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1	everyone needs to do what is required. Other people
2	may know this, but can you refresh my memory as to
3	what PPE is?
4	MR. FRANKEL: Personal protective
5	equipment.
6	JUDGE YOUNG: Okay. Do you provide that
7	or is that something
8	MR. FRANKEL: I will have to check with
9	the plant. I think that was maybe one of the
1.0	logistical issues that was there for us. So I think
11	there's adequate PPE available.
12	JUDGE YOUNG: Okay. The evaporation
L3	pots can be viewed from adjacent road, and adjacent
L4	road that sounds reasonable. Does anyone have any
L5	problem with that?
16	MS. LORENA: No.
L7	JUDGE YOUNG: As to vehicles, does Crowe
L8	Butte have sufficient vehicles and drivers to
L9	support 17 people, which I don't know what size
20	vehicles you have and how many that would entail.
21	But do you think you can handle the 17 in your
22	vehicles?
23	MR. SMITH: We'll need to check. And I'm
24	not sure exactly what vehicles are available for
25	that. The typical vehicles at the site are trucks

1	which just have cabs. So I'll have to look into
2	this a little more closely.
3	JUDGE YOUNG: Okay.
4	MR. FRANKEL: Depending on how many
5.	we're expecting, I can see if we can't come up with
6	a solution.
7	MR. FRANKEL: David Frankel here,
8	Your Honor.
9	If it's permissible and accessible, I'm
10	sure that I can be driven around. One or two of us
11	on our petitioner side can have own vehicles. And if
1:2	need be, we can all show up in our vehicles. So let
13	us know what is most appropriate from the company
14	and safety standpoint and we're happy to oblige.
15	MR. SMITH: Okay.
16	JUDGE YOUNG: Well, Crowe Butte has said
17	that they don't allow private vehicles. And normally
18	when we do site visits the company provides a
19	vehicle or I'm not sure whether sometimes NRC I
20	think we may have driven NRC rented vehicles before.
21	Mr. Smith or Mr. McGuire, either one of
22	you?
23	MR. SMITH: I think the problem here is
24	that the roads are not such that I think you can
25	drive around in a passenger van or anything like
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1	that. So it's going to have to be something that
2	can't hold all of us. We'll endeavor to work it out.
3	I mean, I think we've got some time it looks like if
4	we're doing late July to try and come up with a
5	decent solution.
6	JUDGE YOUNG: Okay.
7	COURT REPORTER: This is the court
8	reporter. Sorry to interrupt, Your Honor.
9	If I could ask the people please
10.	identify themselves when they speak. Because I
11	can't see, I can't always tell by voice alone.
12	JUDGE YOUNG: Thank you very much. And
13	we apologize.
14	This is Ann Young. And I've probably
15	been doing most of the talking, than Mr. Frankel,
16	Mr. Smith and Mr. McGuire a little bit have been the
17	main people talking. Although Ms. Jones from the
18	staff, Mr. Cohen from the staff and for the
19	tribe, what's your name?
20	MS. LORENA: Elizabeth Lorena.
21	JUDGE YOUNG: Elizabeth Lorena also
22	spoke briefly.
23	Did I leave anyone out? Okay.
24	Now, as to the Indian Camp Site, it
25	sounds as though that may be problematic. Does

1	anyone have a suggestion for a solution or is that
2	maybe something that we just need to forego at this
3	point?
4	MS. JONES: Judge, I believe Mr. Cohen
5	has a little bit of information to sort of shed a
6	little light on
7	JUDGE YOUNG: Excuse me. Excuse me.
8	MS. JONES: Judge Young?
9	JUDGE YOUNG: This is Ms. Jones
10	speaking?
11	MS. JONES: Yes. This is Ms. Jones.
12	JUDGE YOUNG: Okay. Start over. I'm
13	sorry.
14	MS. JONES: Okay. My apologies. I
15	should have identified myself.
16	Mr. Cohen I think has a little bit of
17	information, at least that maybe that might help
18	shed a little light on that particular issue. I'm
19	going to let him explain that.
20	JUDGE YOUNG: Thank you.
21	MR. COHEN: I had a conversation with
22	the Nebraska State Historical Society, their State
23	Archeologist. Basically there is no actual location
24	of the site. What she told me was all the most
25	specific location they have is a quarter section,

1	which I believe that encompassed about 160 acres.
2	So in a sense what we would have to do is find a
3	very small site on 160 acres that was identified
4	back in 1959.
. 5	I'm really not sure we're going to be
· 6	able to do that.
7	JUDGE YOUNG: You know, one thing that
8	strikes me is that this is something that the NRC
9	staff will be addressing in your review. So it may
10	be that when you get to that point if there's any
1.1	further information or further I mean, you may
12	actually be consulting with the tribe at that point,
13	we don't know that. But if you do, that might
14	resolve some of those issues.
15	It sounds as though we may need to put
16	that part off and see whether and how that may get
17	resolved later when the staff does its environmental
18	review.
19	MR. FRANKEL: Dave Frankel here. Let me
20	just interject.
21	If we're able, if through tribal leaders
22	or the tribe itself we can help pinpoint a location,
23	then perhaps we could pursue that. But I think that
24	your suggestion is reasonable from my perspective.
25	If we can get any of that information,

1	we can try to get it to you fairly quickly and just
2	make sure that we're not leaving that one
3	unnecessarily aside.
4	JUDGE FRED OLIVER: This is Judge Fred
-· 5	Oliver.
6	Approximately how far is the prehistoric
7	site from the permit area?
8	MR. COHEN: I have to tell you, Judge
9	Oliver, that when I spoke to the State Archeologist
10	I was told that I am not allowed to discuss
11	location. That that's privileged information. The
12	only thing I can tell you is that if the Tribe
13	itself, they can contact the State Archeologist and
14	talk to her, she could probably give you the
15	information at that point. But I'm forbidden from
16	doing so, which is why I haven't already.
17	JUDGE YOUNG: That was Mr. Cohen.
18	MR. COHEN: Oh, I'm sorry. I'm sorry.
19	JUDGE YOUNG: Okay. All right. If the
20	parties are able to work together and come up with
21	something, you're free to do that and let us know.
22	But otherwise I think we'll assume that that won't
23	be part of the visit when we're there in July.
2.4	Now as to which day we do which thing,
25	it may be better to do the argument on the first day
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and the site visit the second day. Does that make 1 2 sense to everyone? 3 MR. FRANKEL: I have no objection, Your 4 Honor. David Frankel. 5 Yes, that sounds fine. MR. McGUIRE: JUDGE YOUNG: All right. We had checked 6 7 on availability of the rooms at Chadron State College for June. We have not yet checked for July, 8 9 but we will check and notify everyone of exact 10 location for July 23rd for the oral argument and 11 provide more information on that in the next week or 12 two. As soon as possible. 13 And then with regard to the site visit 14 ont he 24th, I guess I would ask Crowe Butte counsel 15 to let us know what final arrangements you come up with and when would be a good time for you to let us 16 17 know about that. I mean, I don't think that there's any usual rush. We want you to be able to work 18 everything out in a way that works for you and 19 20 everyone else. 21 MR. SMITH: Okay. I can do that. It'11 22 take us probably a little while to get it all in 23 place, but I think we've got some time. It shouldn't 24 be a problem. 25 JUDGE YOUNG: Okay. Probably during

1	June you'll be able to do that, you think?
2:	MR. SMITH: Oh, I would hope so.
3	JUDGE YOUNG: Okay. Great. All right.
4	Is there anything else that anyone
,5	thinks we need to address today?
6	MR. McGUIRE: This is Mike McGuire.
7	I thought I saw in either an order or
8	something reference to the North Trend area. Judge,
9	were you contemplating that that was going to be
10	part of this process? I'm not saying it should or
11	shouldn't be, but if it is it simply includes more
12	logistically issues because there's some driving
13	distance between the two and some time involved.
14	I can fairly tell you now that you drive
15	by it, and it's just a big open field. I mean,
16	there's nothing there but field. But I think
17	JUDGE COLE: Is there a road going by?
18	MR. McGUIRE: Larry, can you address
19	that?
20	JUDGE YOUNG: That's Judge Cole.
21	MR. DION: This is Larry Dion, Crowe
22	Butte.
23	Yes, there's a county road going by it.
24	JUDGE COLE: But I think if we could
25	just get a view of it, a quick view would be

1	sufficient.
2	MR. McGUIRE: Okay.
3	JUDGE YOUNG: Anything else from any of
4	the parties?
5	MR. SMITH: No, Judge.
6	I just wanted to add that we didn't
7	as we were going through the list of the
8	JUDGE YOUNG: Mr. Smith?
9	MR. SMITH: the items we listed about
10	the tour, I just wanted to remind everyone here that
11	we will need a list of people's name and Social
12	Security numbers in advance of the tour so that we
13	can make sure we comply with security related
14	requirements.
15	JUDGE YOUNG: Right. And that's fairly
16	standard. And how soon would you need those?
17	MR. SMITH: Well, I thin we say in here
18	at least five days prior to the site visit. But,
19	obviously, it's a little bit easier on us if we can
20	do it a week or two before that.
21	JUDGE YOUNG: Okay. So let's say two
22	weeks before?
23	MR. SMITH: That would be fine.
24	JUDGE YOUNG: Which would be I should
25	be calculate that very easily. But that would be
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1	Tuli: 10+h
Т	July 10th.
2	MR FRANKEL: David Frankel here.
3	There's no problem We can do that, Your Honor.
4	JUDGE YOUNG: All right. And everyone's
5	fine with the deadlines we set for briefing on the
6	foreign ownership issue?
7	MS. JONES: Oh, yes, I'm fine, Judge.
8	This is Andrea Jones for NRC staff.
9	MR. SMITH: This is Tyson Smith for
10	Crowe Butte.
11	That is also acceptable.
12	MR. FRANKEL: This is David Frankel
13	here.
14	MS. LORENA: It's fine for OST.
15	MR. FRANKEL: I'm sorry, Ms. Lorena.
16	MS. LORENA: Oh, that's fine. It's fine
17	for OST, too.
18	MR. FRANKEL: All right. David Frankel
19	here.
20	It's fine for WNRC and speaking for Mr.
21	Ellison for Owe Aku.
22	JUDGE YOUNG: Very good.
23	And thank you all. I think that takes
24	care of everything. Can you think of anything,
25	Judge. Judge Oliver.

JUDGE FRED OLIVER: 2 JUDGE YOUNG: Thank you all for your 3 time. And in the next week or so you should be 4 receiving an order confirming all this. And if in 5 your discussions among the parties you come up with 6 7 a suggestion about the Indian Camp, feel free to 8 bring those to let us know about those. Otherwise, we will leave that with you or to be addressed later 9 when the staff does it for you. 10 11 All right. Thank you much. Bye-bye.
