Dear Mr. Crane:

I am responding to your April 24, 2008, letter in which you described your concerns with regard to the individuals serving as patients' rights advocate on the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC) Advisory Committee on the Medical Uses of Isotopes (ACMUI).

We continue to believe that Dr. Darrell Fisher represents patient's perspectives effectively for the following reasons. First, we would note that Dr. Fisher volunteered with the National Association of Cancer Patients Foundation, which is a strictly charitable group involved in patients' rights, care, and counseling, and has no relationship to lobbying activities at Ward Valley. Second, Dr. Fisher's background and experience at Pacific Northwest National Laboratory in radioisotope production for the U.S. Department of Energy adds supplemental background to his patients' rights work.

We intend to continue to have an advocate for the rights of patients on the ACMUI as such a person provides valuable insights to the NRC staff. Maintaining a diverse group of candidates for such a position can be a challenge. Thus, we would welcome nominations from you when Dr. Fisher's term expires.
