Security officers can work 72 hours in a floating seven day period, 26 in a 48, and 16 in a 24 (individual limits.) Group Work Hour averages are different. Security force members working on shift (including shift supervisors) have their hours added up and averaged over six week increments. The six week average limit for non-outage, non-threat level change periods is 48 hours. The FFD Order was issued April 29, 2003 and took effect October 29, 2003. These limits are now incorporated into the new security plan templates and the new plans were effective October 29, 2004.
