Telephone Conversation with ITTA Consultant Requesting Information on the Public Environmental Scoping Process.

Mr. Goodman telephoned the NRC at 10:10 am Tuesday, June 17th 2008 to inquire about the environmental scoping process. Mr. Goodman is a consultant for ITTA, and he informed me that he has a Japanese client interested in learning more about the public scoping process. He explained that in Japan there is no public scoping process like in the United States and that he was researching the process for his client who was interested in learning more. The question Mr. Goodman asked me related to the number of public scoping meetings required during the scoping process. I informed Mr. Goodman that no public meetings were required by regulation, but that only the notice of intent to conduct public scoping was required. I also informed Mr. Goodman that the NRC chooses to conduct public scoping meetings to demonstrate the NRC's willingness to provide the public a forum for expressing their views. Mr. Goodman wanted to know the reasoning behind the decision to have one public meeting versus two public meetings for certain projects. He particularly inquired as to why the Lee project had only held one public meeting while other projects had held two. As the environmental project manager for Lee I explained to Mr. Goodman that the decision to hold one public meeting was based on the number of participants at a public outreach meeting held by the safety side of the NRC in Gaffney, South Carolina the previous year. There had been approximately 200 participants at that public outreach meeting. Therefore, based on the number of participants at the public outreach meeting and the fact that Gaffney is not a large town it was thus decided that one meeting at a well known location that could accommodate all who choose to attend would be most effective in terms of reaching the public.

To close the conversation Mr. Goodman expressed this thanks and I directed Mr. Goodman to the NRC public website where he could search for more information if he liked. He informed me that he was on the NRC website, but that the questions he had were specific and thus that prompted his call. I also let Mr. Goodman know that he was welcome to call anytime if he had further questions.


