Subject: GLE Submittal of FOCI Information for Planned Organizational Change

Dear Sirs:

This submits foreign ownership, control, or influence (FOCI) information for GE-Hitachi Global Laser Enrichment LLC (GLE), for information only with respect to 10 CFR 95.17(a)(1) and in support of ongoing enrichment technology development activities of GLE personnel working under U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) license SNM-1097 issued to Global Nuclear Fuel-Americas, LLC (GNF-A). The information provided herewith reflects a planned change in the GLE organizational structure.

GLE first advised NRC staff (Mr. Bryan Smith et al) of the contemplated organizational change in a meeting on April 8, 2008, and discussed the change further with staff (Mr. J.K. Everly) on May 29 and June 10, 2008. As a follow-up to those discussions, Enclosure 1 provides the anticipated FOCI-related details associated with the change. Enclosure 2 provides a summary listing of Owners, Officers, Directors, and Executive Personnel (OODEP) and other FOCI information for GLE and its parents for the current organizational structure and the planned structure. The details in Enclosures 1 and 2 are preliminary since it is possible that there may be some minor changes as we finalize the details. If the contemplated organizational change is implemented, GLE, in accordance with 10 CFR 95.17(a)(1), will provide a formal FOCI submittal reflecting the final details of the organizational changes within thirty (30) days of the implementation of the changes and will identify any differences between the preliminary and final details.

As discussed in Enclosure 1, GLE anticipates that the NRC, after review of the proposed changes and controls, will be able to conclude that the degree and extent of FOCI over GLE as a result of the changes do not pose an undue risk to the national security. For reference, the initial FOCI information submittal for GLE was transmitted via Reference 1, and the most recent prior update was provided by Reference 2.

GLE respectfully requests that NRC conduct an initial review of the preliminary information provided in Enclosures 1 and 2 and advise GLE of any substantive FOCI-related concerns related to the planned organizational structure change which might be identified by NRC. As noted previously to NRC staff, it is the intention of GLE to implement this organizational change before the end of June 2008. Accordingly, we ask that NRC provide the requested review as soon as possible. Should the NRC require additional information concerning this letter or the organizational change described herein, please contact either me or Harold Neems, GLE General Counsel, at 910-675-5376.

Please note that Enclosures 1 and 2 contain personally identifiable information and also information of the type that GEH and GLE maintain in confidence and withhold from public disclosure. The affidavit contained in Enclosure 3 herewith identifies that information contained in Enclosures 1 and 2 herewith has been handled and classified as proprietary and/or confidential by GEH and GLE. GEH hereby requests that information in Enclosures 1 and 2 be withheld from public disclosure in accordance with the provisions of 10 CFR 2.390 and 9.17. Per request of NRC staff, such information enclosed herewith has been labeled "Proprietary Information" to correspond to labeling practices of personnel reviewing this submittal.

Affidavit for GEH

AFFIDAVIT

I, **Louis M. Quintana**, state as follows:

- (1) I am Program Manager, EHS Licensing, GE-Hitachi Nuclear Energy Americas LLC (“GEH”), have been delegated the function of reviewing the information described in paragraph (2) which is sought to be withheld, and have been authorized to apply for its withholding..
- (2) The information sought to be withheld is contained in GEH’s letter, L. M. Quintana to U.S. NRC Document Control Desk, Letter No. LMQ-08-025, *GLE Submittal of FOCI Information Update for Planned Organizational Change*, dated June 16, 2008, and its Enclosures 1, Description of Planned GLE Organizational Change, and 2, *Lists of Owners, Officers, Directors, and Executive Personnel and Other FOCI Information for Planned Organizational Change*. In the above-cited Enclosures 1 and 2 to Letter LMQ-08-025, the GEH confidential information is indicated by [[enclosing it between left and right double brackets^{3}]], with the superscript notation ^{3} referring to Paragraph (3) of this affidavit, which provides the basis for the designation as confidential information, and those documents are also marked with the designation “GEH Proprietary Information and Personally Identifiable Information” at the top of each page.
- (3) In making this application for withholding of confidential information of which it is the owner or licensee, GEH relies upon the exemptions from disclosure set forth in the Freedom of Information Act (“FOIA”), 5 USC Sec. 552(b)(4), and the Trade Secrets Act, 18 USC Sec. 1905, and NRC regulations 10 CFR 9.17(a)(4), 9.17(a)(6), 2.390(a)(4), and 2.390(a)(6) for “trade secrets and commercial or financial information” (Exemption 4) and “personnel and medical files” (Exemption 6). The material for which exemption from disclosure is here sought is all “confidential commercial information” or “personnel information”, and some portions also may also qualify under the narrower definition of “trade secret”, within the meanings assigned to those terms for purposes of FOIA Exemption 4 in, respectively, Critical Mass Energy Project v. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, 975F2d871 (DC Cir. 1992), and Public Citizen Health Research Group v. FDA, 704F2d1280 (DC Cir. 1983).
- (4) Some examples of categories of information which fit into the definition of confidential, trade secret, or proprietary information are:
 - a. Information that discloses a process, method, or apparatus, including supporting data and analyses, where prevention of its use by GEH’s competitors without license from GEH constitutes a competitive economic advantage over other companies;
 - b. Information which, if used by a competitor, would reduce his expenditure of resources or improve his competitive position in the design, manufacture, shipment, installation, assurance of quality, or licensing of a similar product;

- c. Information which reveals organizational structures, cost or price information, production capacities, budget levels, or commercial strategies of GEH, its customers, or its suppliers;
- d. Information which reveals aspects of past, present, or future GEH customer-funded development plans and programs, resulting in potential products to GEH;
- e. Information which discloses patentable subject matter for which it may be desirable to obtain patent protection.

The information sought to be withheld is considered to be confidential because it reveals confidential commercial and/or financial information regarding the operations of GEH and its related joint venture entities or reveals personal information of individuals, and some information of the former information is also considered proprietary for the reasons set forth in paragraph (4)c. above.

- (5) To address 10 CFR 2.390 (b) (4), the information sought to be withheld is being submitted to NRC in confidence. The information is of a sort customarily held in confidence by GEH, and is in fact so held. The information sought to be withheld has, to the best of my knowledge and belief, consistently been held in confidence by GEH, no public disclosure has been made, and it is not available in public sources. All disclosures to third parties including any required transmittals to NRC, have been made, or must be made, pursuant to regulatory provisions or confidentiality or proprietary agreements which provide for maintenance of the information in confidence. Its initial designation as confidential or proprietary information, and the subsequent steps taken to prevent its unauthorized disclosure, are as set forth in paragraphs (6) and (7) following.
- (6) Initial approval of confidential or proprietary treatment of a document is made by the manager of the originating component, the person most likely to be acquainted with the value and sensitivity of the information in relation to industry knowledge. Access to such documents within GEH is limited on a “need to know” basis.
- (7) The procedure for approval of external release of such a document typically requires review by the staff manager, project manager, principal scientist or other equivalent authority, by the manager of the cognizant marketing function (or his delegate), and by the Legal Operation, for technical content, competitive effect, and determination of the accuracy of the confidential or proprietary designation. Disclosures outside GEH are limited to regulatory bodies, customers, and potential customers, and their agents, suppliers, and licensees, and others with a legitimate need for the information, and then only in accordance with appropriate regulatory provisions or confidentiality or proprietary agreements.
- (8) The information identified in paragraph (2), above, is classified as confidential because it reveals commercial and/or financial information regarding the operations of GEH and its related joint venture entities or reveals personal information of individuals. Some of the information is considered proprietary because it contains internal organizational structures.
- (9) Public disclosure of the information sought to be withheld is inconsistent with the intent of the requirements for submittal and is likely to cause harm to GEH’s competitive position

and foreclose or reduce the availability of profit-making opportunities and would reveal personal privacy information and potentially reduce information security.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing affidavit and the matters stated therein are true and correct to the best of my knowledge, information, and belief.
