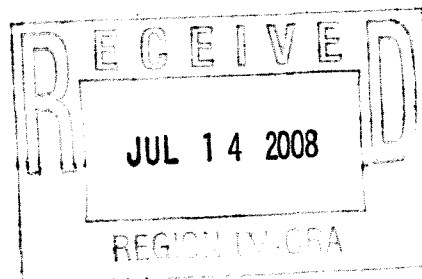

Subject: Uranium in Soils at the Piñon Canyon Maneuvering Site, Fort Carson, Colorado


Dear Representative McKinley:

Thank you for your letter of June 23, 2008 calling upon the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (the department) to accept the U.S. Army's invitation to conduct further soil testing at the Piñon Canyon Maneuver Site (PCMS). We understand and share your concerns for the well being of the soldiers and civilians living in your district and throughout southeastern Colorado.

On June 24, 2008, I sent a letter (attached) to Major General Mark Graham at Fort Carson, asking the Army to investigate and characterize the potential for elevated concentrations of uranium in soil at PCMS, to determine whether it is naturally occurring, and to evaluate any associated health threats. This department stands ready to assist the Army in developing plans to conduct a systematic, scientifically valid investigation of this issue.

We will keep you informed of the Army's response to my request, and of next steps, and will keep you apprised of new developments as they occur.
