Larry,

Could you please verify that your John Rycyna has in fact placed me on his list for future distribution of such instructions, or ask him to email me that he has done so, so that therefore I will have the opportunity to fully consider intervening in the Unistar-Calvert Cliffs new reactor licensing?

What was bothering me was that from somewhere I had understood that once Calvert Cliffs appeared on your notice site (see last link below), one had only 60 days to file to intervene. So there would be less than 60 days already. The last time I looked, how many weeks ago, it was not on the list.

Is the 60 days already running? You can understand my urgency, and my disappointment with your answer to my request for information, since it is your name and email that is provided in that notice in that list for contact by interested parties. After some scanning via the links you provided, which I do feel I have a responsibility to cover yet more, the immediate concern above remains. So I don't feel I got much help with a specific and simple inquiry.
