Medical Review Officer (MRO) Six Month Report

Our records indicate the following:

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From January 1, 2008 through June 30, 2008, the Licensee Personnel pool experienced four (4) confirmed positives. The Pre-Access category experienced three (3) confirmed positives for a single substance and the For Cause/Observed Behavior category experienced one (1) confirmed positive for a single substance.

From January 1, 2008 through June 30, 2008, the Short-Term Contractor Personnel pool experienced eight (8) confirmed positives. The Pre-Access category experienced six (6) confirmed positives for a single substance, one (1) confirmed positive for alcohol and one (1) confirmed positive for two (2) substances.

Pre-Access Program

In the Licensee Personnel Pool Pre–Access Program category, three (3) individuals applying for temporary employment experienced confirmed positives for a single substance. Two (2) individuals participated in a face-to-face interview with the Medical Review Officer and one (1) individual participated telephonically in an interview with the Medical Review Officer. All individuals were provided and declined the opportunity for a split sample. The Medical Review Officer adjudicated all three (3) individuals as confirmed positive, recommended denial of unescorted access and participation with successful completion of a Drug and Alcohol treatment program.

In the Short-Term Contractor Personnel Pool, six (6) individuals experienced confirmed positives for a single substance, participated in a face-to-face interview with the Medical Review Officer, denial of unescorted access and referral to their respective employers' Employee Assistance Program was recommended. All individuals declined split specimen testing. One (1) individual experienced a confirmed positive for two (2) substances, participated in a face-to-face interview with the MRO, denial of unescorted access and referral to the respective employers' Employee Assistance Program was recommended. One (1) individual experienced a confirmed positive for alcohol. The individual was offered a blood alcohol draw and declined. The individual participated in a face-to-face interview with the Medical Review Officer, denial of unescorted access and participation in the respective employers' Employee Assistance Program was remployee Assistance Program was recommended. The individual participated in a face-to-face interview with the individual was offered a blood alcohol draw and declined. The individual participation in the respective employers' Employee Assistance Program was recommended. The Medical Review Officer adjudicated all individuals as confirmed positive.

For Cause – Observed Behavior

In the Licensee Personnel Pool For Cause – Observed Behavior category, one (1) individual experienced a confirmed positive for a single substance. The individual participated in a telephonic interview with the Medical Review Officer. The forwarding of split sample was offered and declined. The Medical Review Officer recommended denial of unescorted access and participation with successful completion of a Drug and Alcohol Program. The Medical Review Officer adjudicated as a confirmed positive.
