In reply to your letter of February 1. 1996 1 send you herewith an amplification and correction of your understanding of my concern as you suggested.

Watts for lake water which wools Watts Bar nuclears blant's radioactive core helds sediment contaminated by radioactive material Over a lifetime of Watte Bar nuclear plant operation uncontrolled access to this lake will disturb its sediment. in turn contaminating water drawn into the nuclear cooling system. This heightened radioactive contamination of nuclear plant emission has not been previously addressed. No action is being considered to restrict lake use or to remove radioautive This "record of decision" by Department of Energy. materiai. Environmental Protection Agency. U. S. Army Corps of Engineers. state of Tennessee and Tennessee Valley Authority appears in an interagency document dated September, 1995.

I believe this concern is serious enough to warrant rescinding operation licensing of Watts Bar nuclear plant until its I lts resolution.

I understand resolution of the issue is with Project Directorate II-3 of Division of Reactor Projects -I/II. Please keep me advised as you conduct the review. It would be inappropriate to consult with the utility in advance or to proceed without independent evaluation.
