Fitness for Duty Program Six Month Performance Report January - June 2008

PROGRAM SUMMARY:

The Waterford 3 annual random testing rate is 50 percent. During this reporting period, approximately 27.5 percent of the population has been randomly tested. The rate of positive tests from random testing is 0.00 percent.

POSITIVE RESULTS:

As shown on the attached sheets, there were nine positive tests during this reporting period. These samples were confirmed positive for cocaine, opiates, alcohol, and marijuana at the cut-off established by the NRC.

MANAGEMENT ACTIONS:

During this reporting period, six for-cause tests were requested. Two were requested due to behavior issues and four were due to accidents. All six samples returned negative results.

Nineteen follow-up samples were collected. Eight samples were collected from two licensee employees due to Company established follow-up programs. Eleven samples were collected from contractors due to programs established in the industry. All follow-up samples returned negative results.

Fifteen samples were collected under the "Other" category. Ten samples collected returned results showing low creatinine. Additional samples were collected from these individuals as "Other" and sent for testing. All ten of these collections returned negative results. Five pre-access samples collected for testing were suspect due to the temperature reading. Additional samples were collected as "Other" and sent for testing. Three of these samples returned postive results. Management was notified of the three positives, and the individuals' files were annotated to reflect the positive results and management's actions.

Six samples collected under pre-access testing returned positive results. Management was notified of the positives, and the individuals' files were annotated to reflect the positive results and management's actions.
