Everyone-

I understand there has been some confusion regarding the rate and length of stay for the Hilton-Garden Inn. First let me apologize, for whatever reasons the hotels are not as friendly about such large groups of people NRC would like to bring. Therefore, my advice to you is make your reservations for only the amount of days you expect to be in Mineral (i.e. If you expect to finish up Thursday, make your reservation for up to that day). With that being said if after being at the site Monday and Tuesday you see that you will need an additional day, when you get back to the hotel ask the desk clerk to extend your stay. The hotel has indicated there will be no additional charge for adding on nights. In the past we have never had problems disembarking early but for whatever reasons the Hilton-Garden Fredericksburg is not accommodating us in the early checkout early scenario.

I expect most folks to check out on Thursday. This is due to the Scoping meeting being held Wednesday night. With the Scoping meeting being held on Wednesday night: 1)most of the team should get a full day of work accomplished and 2) I don't not expect anyone will be driving home after the meeting ends (probably like midnight).

Please use sound judgment when setting your room reservation. I wanted to warn everyone b/c the hotel will charge for an extra night if you check out early. As an FYI, one way to make an educated guess on how long you might need to stay is by talking with your PNNL counterpart. There should be a "gameplan" formulated between you both on what and who you will need to see and talk with. As indicated in an email sent earlier this week, please provide me with detailed additions to the site audit schedule by noon tomorrow.

Please call and secure your reservation with personal credit card. The block is under NRC, Nuclear Regulatory Commission, or Alicia Williamson. The rate is \$79/\$88 depending on your arrival date. Note the per diem allotted rate falls short of the actual rate. NRC folks should make the following adjustments to their travel authorization: Put in Mineral, VA 70/39/109 and check box 23B and in Details/justification box say "23B: Request approval for actual lodging + \$39 (hotel is \$88/night); closest acceptable hotels to North Anna site are in Frederickburg, VA."

Modes of Transportation: Washington area airports (Dulles International, Reagan-National International) and Richmond International airport. Directions are below.

I expect most folks from Washington area to drive down. There are three options: Use of Govt. vehicle (http://www.internal.nrc.gov/ADM/transportation/offictransport_udriveit.html); Rental car from outside company (reserve with travel); or drive your privately owned vehicle (48.5 cents/day). If you plan to rent a car please try to save resources and car pool. As we get closer to the audit date a car pool matrix will be formulated.

Please plan to meet in the lobby of Hilton Garden Inn-Fredericksburg at 7:00pm Sunday night. If you are not able to make it due to travel arrangements, just let me or Laura Quinn know.

Dress Code: During the Site Audit business casual and field attire (when tromping in woods). Business casual is Docker-style pants/jeans with a polo-type shirt. For the Scoping meeting professional business attire is expected.

General Trip Information:

The site audit is expected to begin Monday, April 14, 2008 at approx. 8:30am. This will be dependant on how long it takes to get through security. We plan to leave the hotel at approx 7:00am to caravan to the site. Please be on time for the kick-off meeting.

The Scoping meeting will be Wednesday, April 16, 2008. Open house is set to begin at 5:30pm. I know this is a little early but this meeting will be heavily attended.

From NRC to Louisa County High School

1. Start out going NORTHWEST on ROCKVILLE PIKE/MD-355 N toward MARINELLI RD.
2. Turn LEFT onto MD-187 S/OLD GEORGETOWN RD. (2.61 miles)
3. Merge onto CAPITAL BELTWAY/I-495 W toward NORTHERN VIRGINIA/FAIRFAX. 19mi
4. Merge onto I-95 S via EXIT 57A toward RICHMOND. (52.92 miles)
5. Take the VA-606 exit- EXIT 118- toward THORNBURG. (0.30 miles)
6. Turn RIGHT onto MUDD TAVERN RD. (0.52 miles)
7. MUDD TAVERN RD becomes MORRIS RD. (4.55 miles)
8. MORRIS RD becomes VA-208/COURTHOUSE RD. (3.76 miles)

9. Turn LEFT onto VA-208/COURTHOUSE RD. Continue to follow VA-208. (20.25miles)
10. Turn LEFT onto US-522. (5.00 miles)
11. Turn RIGHT onto VA-208/VA-22 (I think VA-208 and US-522 are the same highway)
11. End at 757 Davis Hwy Mineral, VA 23117 US

From NRC to Hilton Garden Inn-Fredericksburg

1. Start out going NORTHWEST on ROCKVILLE PIKE/MD-355 N toward MARINELLI RD.
2. Turn LEFT onto MD-187 S/OLD GEORGETOWN RD. (2.61 miles)
3. Merge onto CAPITAL BELTWAY/I-495 W toward NORTHERN VIRGINIA/FAIRFAX.19mi
4. Merge onto I-95 S via EXIT 57A toward RICHMOND. (39.2 miles)
5. Take Exit 130B in Fredericksburg, VA (Culpeper West)
6. At the 1st traffic light (there is a BIG RED sign) turn RIGHT on to Carl D. Silver Parkway (2 miles)
7. You will go through the shopping area and cross over Fall Hill Avenue. Upon passing the Sheetz gas station turn RIGHT onto Hospitality Lane.
8. Follow to the Hilton Garden-Inn hotel.

Total Estimated Time: 1 hour 15 minutes: Total Distance 67 miles

From IAD to Hilton Garden Inn-Fredericksburg

1. Merge onto Dulles Access Road
2. Take the VA-28 exit, EXIT 9A, toward VA-7/STERLING/US-50/CENTREVILLE VA (15 miles)
3. Turn Left onto Liberia Ave. LIBERIA AVE becomes VA-3000 S/PRINCE WILLIAM PKWY. (3 miles)
4. Turn LEFT onto VA-234 S/DUMFRIES RD (14 miles)
5. Follow to I-95 South toward RICHMOND (20 miles)
6. Take Exit 130B in Fredericksburg, VA (Culpeper West)
7. At the 1st traffic light (there is a BIG RED sign) turn RIGHT on to Carl D. Silver Parkway (2 miles)
8. You will go through the shopping area and cross over Fall Hill Avenue. Upon passing the Sheetz gas station turn RIGHT onto Hospitality Lane.
9. Follow to the Hilton Garden-Inn hotel.

From Richmond Intl Airport to Hilton Garden Inn-Fredericksburg

1. Within Richmond Airport follow signs to I-295 North (3 miles)
2. Merge onto I-295 North toward I-64 W/CHARLOTTESVILLE/I-95 N/WASHINGTON (12 miles)
3. Merge onto I-95 N via EXIT 43A on the LEFT toward WASHINGTON (47 miles)
4. Take Exit 130B onto Plank Road/Rt 3 West in Fredericksburg, VA (toward Culpeper).
5. Follow Rt 3 West to Carl D. Silver Blvd.
6. Turn Right at the traffic light (there is a BIG RED sign) turn RIGHT on to Carl D. Silver Parkway (2 miles)
7. You will go through the shopping area and cross over Fall Hill Avenue. Upon passing the Sheetz gas station turn RIGHT onto Hospitality Lane.
8. Follow to the Hilton Garden-Inn hotel.

From Hilton Garden Inn-Fredericksburg to North Anna Site

1. Go back to I-95 via Carl D. Silver Parkway (2 miles)
2. Take I-95 South to the exit for Thornburg (Exit 118) (10 miles)
3. Exit 118 Thornburg and take Route 606 West (Mudd Tavern Rd turns into Morris Rd)
4. In the town of Snell (about 5 miles), Route 208 will join from the right.

5. From this point on, follow Route 208 West.
6. Around the town of Post Oak (after an additional 3.8 miles), Route 208 turns LEFT (southward).
6. You'll cross Lake Anna (about 11 miles later)
7. Turn LEFT onto Route 652, Kentucky Springs Rd. (3.3 miles)
8. Turn LEFT when you come to the flashing yellow light at Route 700. This becomes the site access road.
9. The North Anna Nuclear Information Center is the first building you will come to.

From Richmond Airport to North Anna Site

1. Within Richmond Airport follow signs to I-295 North (3 miles)
2. Merge onto I-295 North toward I-64 W/CHARLOTTESVILLE/I-95 N/WASHINGTON (12 miles)
3. Follow and get onto I-64 West
4. After about 19 miles, take Exit 159 onto Rt 522 heading North.
5. After about 15 miles, at the town of Cuckoo, there'll be a stop sign where you meet up with Rt 33. Go LEFT, which is the continuation of Rt 522 North and also Rt 33 West.
6. When Rt 522 North branches off to the RIGHT (after about a half mile), take it (i.e., stay with Rt 522 North). You'll be on this road about 2.3 miles.
7. After you pass the Texaco station on the right, look for a small sign for Rt 700 to the right. There are also green signs for the Landfill and the Animal Shelter. Turn RIGHT onto this Rt 700 (going north).
8. You'll be on this winding road about 1.8 miles, crossing some railroad tracks along the way.
9. When you come to the stop sign at Fredericks Hall Rd, turn RIGHT.
10. About 0.4 miles later you have to turn LEFT to follow Rt 700 (you'll also see a green sign for the North Anna Nuclear Info Center).
11. About 4.5 miles after that you'll reach the stop sign and flashing light at Rt 652, Kentucky Springs Rd. Go straight, this road becomes the site access road after you cross Rt 652. The North Anna Nuclear Information Center is the first building you will come to.
