SEQUOYAH (SQN), BROWNS FERRY (BFN), WATTS BAR (WBN), AND BELLEFONTE (BLN) NUCLEAR PLANTS - CHANGES TO THE NUCLEAR QUALITY ASSURANCE (NQA) PROGRAM DESCRIPTION - TVA TOPICAL REPORT, TVA-TR75-1A

In accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR 50.54(a)(3) and 10 CFR 50.55(f)(3), TVA has changed the description of our quality assurance program with regard to the commitment to American National Standards Institute (ANSI) N45.2.2 - 1972.

This change was originally transmitted to NRC by letter dated July 14, 1988. However, because of concerns raised by the WBN NRC Resident Inspector, further clarification is considered appropriate.

Table 17D-1, sheet 2, item 5, and Table 17D-2, sheet 4, item 4, of the subject document, are changed to state:

Section 6.4.2(8). TVA will follow vendor recommendations/requirements for preventive maintenance, or provide an engineering evaluation, or an engineering requirements document delineating appropriate maintenance requirements, for items in storage.

Additionally, in order to clarify our intent with regard to preventive maintenance after release of items from permanent storage, the following change has been made.

Table 17D-1, sheet 2, add item 6, and Table 17D-2, sheet 4, change item 5 to state:

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Section 6.5 (last sentence). During a period of installed storage or extended layup after release of an item from permanent storage, vendor recommendations/requirements for preventive maintenance, or an engineering evaluation, or engineering requirements document delineating appropriate maintenance requirements if different than vendor requirements will be followed.
