Dear Mr. DeLaBarre:

Enclosed is an application from Global Nuclear Fuel – Americas, L.L.C. (GNF), dated August 14, 2008, requesting amendment No. 05 to export license XSNM01662. The license presently authorizes the export of up to 33,000.0 kilograms (kg) U-235 contained in 825,100.0 kg uranium enriched to 5.0 weight percent maximum, in the form of fuel bundles, to Taiwan for use as initial core and reload fuel in the Lungmen 1 and 2 nuclear power reactors. GNF is requesting Amendment No. 05 to add the authorization required to export Australian-obligated material to the license. In accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR Part 110.50(b)(3), this amendment is needed to authorize the export of foreign-origin material.

Since no other changes to the terms and conditions of the existing license are requested, we intend to issue this minor amendment after the 30-day time period allotted for public review expires and it is determined that applicable export license criteria are met.
