FITNESS FOR DUTY (FFD) PROGRAM PERFORMANCE DATA: JULY-DECEMBER 1995

In accordance with 10 CFR 26.71(d), enclosed is TVA's FFD Program Performance Data for the six-month period of July 1-December 31, 1995. Enclosure 1 contains a discussion of recent FFD program developments and FFD trends since the latest reporting period. Enclosures 2-5 contain the performance data and summary of TVA management actions for TVA's nuclear plant sites (Browns Ferry, Sequoyah, Watts Bar, and Bellefonte). The data for TVA Nuclear Corporate organization (primarily employees assigned to Chattanooga and Knoxville) is consolidated in Enclosure 6. There was one FFD event reported to the NRC pursuant to 10 CFR 26.73 during this six-month period which is included as Enclosure 7.

The random testing rate of drug and alcohol use is designed at an annual rate equal to or greater than 50 percent of the workforce that is subject to random testing.

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#### TENNESSEE VALLEY AUTHORITY (TVA) FITNESS FOR DUTY (FFD) PERFORMANCE DATA JULY 1-DECEMBER 31, 1995

#### FFD Developments

There were two matters associated with the FFD program which TVA would like to make aware to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). Listed below are the circumstances and the corresponding corrective actions.

#### Erroneous Reports by the NIDA-Certified Laboratory

#### A. Summary

On July 21, 1995, the contract laboratory reported a drug screen on an individual as positive for marijuana. The Medical Review Officer interviewed the individual and sent him to the Human Resources office. Later that morning, the laboratory called to state that the original report was erroneous and that the individual was also positive for cocaine. The individual was then reinterviewed.

On July 24, 1995, the results of a blind proficiency sample guaranteed as positive were reported by the lab as negative. Both problems were caused by a computer error.

Also on July 24, 1995, five boxes of specimens were sent to the laboratory. When the results were not received the next day, it was discovered that through a clerical error, the lab had opened the outer seal on the shipping box. Rather than unloading the box for testing, the specimens were shipped back to the site.

#### B. Corrective Action

For the first two issues, corrected reports were sent by the lab to TVA. For the third issue, the specimens were sent back to the lab for testing, and new specimens were collected for each individual involved. There were no positive tests on the initial screens or the repeat collections.

Based on these recent experiences, TVA is working to contract with another NIDA laboratory.

#### II. Bellefonte Nuclear Plant (BLN) FFD Program

#### A. Summary

In September 1995, BLN (a TVA nuclear construction site) had a reduction in personnel which reduced the onsite population to approximately 80 employees. A decision was made to reduce the BLN 7FD program from the standard TVA Nuclear FFD program to the NRC minimum requirements for a nuclear construction facility.

The new BLN program was implemented on October 1, 1995. The random testing population still includes everyone onsite, is designed to test at 52 percent annually, and testing will be randomly conducted between 10-15 times per year.

#### JANUARY 1-JUNE 30, 1995

#### TRENDS

The confirmed positive test rate for all categories (preemployment, prebadging, for-cause, post-accident, random, follow-up, and other) for this reporting period was 0.81 percent (29 positive tests) which was 0.14 percent lower than the last reporting period. The rate of random confirmed positives was 0.27 percent (7 positive tests) which is 0.23 percent lower than the last reporting period.

### SUMMARY OF MANAGEMENT ACTIONS FOR BROWNS FERRY NUCLEAR PLANT

In the pre-access category, five contract employees tested positive. The contract employees were denied access and returned to the contractor.

In the random testing category, one contract employee tested positive. The individual also had an alcohol level which fell between 0.02 - 0.39 BAC. This person did not have an unescorted access badge. The individual was removed from the site and returned to the contractor.

#### SUMMARY OF MANAGEMENT ACTIONS FOR SEQUOYAH NUCLEAR PLANT

In the pre-access category, 12 contract employees tested positive. These contract employees were denied access and returned to the contractor.

In the random testing category, two licensee employees and one contract employee tested positive. Only one individual had unescorted access, and the badge was revoked. One licensee employee was referred to the EAP and did not regain medical clearance to return to work. The employee's TVA employment was terminated. The other licensee employee was randomly tested and, before the test results were reported, transferred to a nonnuclear organization. That organization has taken management action. The contract employee was removed from the site and returned to the contractor. The contract employee who refused testing was denied plant access.

In the "for cause" testing category, one contract employee tested positive. The individual's unescorted access badge was revoked, and the individual was removed from the site and returned to the contractor.

#### SUMMARY OF MANAGEMENT ACTIONS FOR WATTS HAR NUCLEAR PLANT

In the pre-access testing category, four contract employees tested positive. The contract employees were denied access and returned to the contractor.

In the random testing category, two contract employees and one licensee employee tested positive. Both contract employees were removed from TVA work and returned to the contractor. The licensee employee was referred to the EAP and returned to work 133 days after the Medical Review Officer confirmed the positive test result. The employee is in the follow-up testing program.
