SUBJECT: DECOMMISSIONING ACTIVITIES AT NAVAL STATION GREAT LAKES

In accordance with the Navy Work Plan for the Remediation of the Recreation and Center Tank Areas and Site-Wide Final Status Survey, November 2004 and Addendums - Final Public Private Venture Area Remediation, May 2007 and Final Site-Specific Derived Concentration Guideline Level, August 2007, Navy has concluded decommissioning activities at Naval Station Great Lakes. Enclosure (1) is the final report of characterization, remediation, and final status survey activities in the Public-Private Venture - Forrestal Village Area that demonstrates the site is suitable for release to unrestricted use. A final status survey report for the Former Monazite Sand Storage Area was forwarded to you in June 2008. These two reports demonstrate all areas at Naval Station Great Lakes are acceptable for release to unrestricted use.
