Enclosed is a copy of the legally binding requirements (license conditions) that our program plans to use in implementing the National Source Tracking System (NSTS) requirements. Our program plans to implement these requirements through two license conditions contained in the main body of the license which tie-down to an Annex to the license, similar to what was done with Increased Controls requirements. The legally binding requirements correspond to the following equivalent amendments to NRCs requirements.
