Exercise Scenario Enhancements "In-Progress Review" Conference

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Historical Perspective

NRC-driven initiative (Bulletin 2005-02)

- □ EP enhancements based on post 9/11 threat environment
- Long-term expectation that security event (threat) scenario would be incorporated into one biennial exercise over a cycle

Regulatory Information Summary (RIS) 2006-12 (July 18, 2006)

- Endorsed Industry White Paper, "Enhancements in EP Programs for Hostile Action"
- Proposed a "phased" approach



Phase III: Hostile Action-Based EP Drills

- VISION: Demonstrate unique challenges posed by a hostile action-based (HAB) event
- "No fault" (non-evaluated)
 - NRC/FEMA observation
- Opportunity to vet industry guidelines (NEI 06-04) and inform process
 - Focus on unique challenges posed by HAB event, rather than full scope of normal REP exercise



Phase III: Hostile Action-Based EP Drills

- RIS 2008-08 (3/19/08) endorsed Revision 1 to NEI 06-04
 - Applicable only to Phase 3 drills
 - Incorporated lessons-learned to ensure consistency in remaining Phase III drills thru CY 2009
- Endorsement emphasizes key points for consideration:
 - Focus on staff observations (unique challenges)
 - Not limited to Incident Command Post, but key unified command activities
 - Prioritization of activities and coordination of resources with licensee and State/local emergency operations centers
- Not intended as a fire fighting or mass casualty response drill
 - Focus on response coordination (interface/communications)



Moving Forward

- Continue to gain experience through conduct of Phase III drills (through CY 2009)
 - HAB EP Drill Working Group (NRC/FEMA/NEI)
 - Support proposed industry workshops
 - Pre-tabletop/drill interface
 - Continued observation
 - Use of "pilot" drills



Long-Term

Commission Staff Requirements Memorandum (June 29, 2006):

"...coordinate with DHS to develop emergency planning exercise scenarios which would help avoid anticipatory responses associated with preconditioning of participants by incorporating a wide spectrum of releases (ranging from little or no release to a large release) and events, including security-based events. These scenarios should emphasize the expected interfaces and coordination between key decision-makers based on realistic postulated events."

Joint FEMA/NRC Exercise Scenario Task Force



Biennial Exercise Integration

- FEMA/NRC Vision (Goal: CY 2010)
 - Implement required EP rulemakings and guidance changes to support <u>biennial exercise scenarios</u> that address:
 - "Pre-conditioning" (Commission SRM)
 - Hostile action-based initiating events (Bulletin 2005-02)
 - Not require separate "off-year" evaluated drill
- Parallel activities being coordinated with FEMA:
 - Proposed NRC Rulemaking
 - Proposed Supplement to NUREG-0654/FEMA-REP-1
 - Revision to FEMA REP Program Manual



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
