This is in reference to your letter dated September 18, 2008, providing the Final Status Survey Report for the Rad Yard area licensed under Nuclear Regulatory Commission License No. 19-10306-01. In order to continue our review, we need the following additional information:

A Licensee must also be considered and appropriately accounted for the dose contribution from previous site releases. Please discuss other site releases in the area and its dose contribution impact upon the Rad Yard area.
